

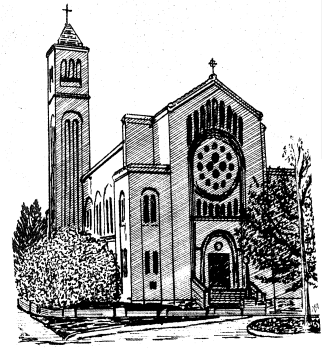

1st Sunday of Advent, Year C

Remember, almost 20 years ago now, that anti-terrorism ad which sounded the warning "Be alert, but not alarmed"? Sadly, such a slogan was appropriate for the dangers our world faced anew. Yet for a different reason, I think such a phrase also seems a fitting exhortation for us and all people of faith – or so Jesus teaches on this first Sunday of Advent. "Stay awake!" he says.

But what are we in danger of falling asleep to?

The word advent – like many others – has its origins in the Latin *adventus*, a word which expresses the time of waiting and preparation leading up to Christmas. In its purest form however, *adventus* can also translate as *invasion*, *incursion*, or *appearing*. It's relation to military homecomings is especially interesting. In ancient Rome the term was used to express the 'glorious entry' of the emperor back into his city, often following a military victory. As happens however, over time minds and hearts drifted from the word's origin and so the richness of what 'Advent' truly signifies.

Advent speaks of the mystery in and for which you and I are created. In truth, our whole lives are an advent. And so with this joyous season upon us once more, we enter a season of waiting and hoping, sure. Yet not a waiting for the God whom we hope to find, but rather the God who burst in to finds us; who enters creation and comes *all the way to us*, in his humanity.

It is all God's doing. God come to us, his glorious entrance into the broken city of our humanity; to announce victory and reclaim what is his.

Advent is a time then of unfathomable mercy. It is a time for us to grow in our desire for the one who knows, seeks and desires to be close to us. It is a time to seek the Lord's healing touch in Confession, and to sit with him in Adoration.

We need never be afraid of Jesus' coming, but long for it, living each day in joyful expectation of him who is everything the human heart longs for. In these days we set our sights firmly then on the infinite mercy that takes flesh in Jesus.

Jesus is Hope and Promise born into our broken, confusing, covid-shaken world. And he is given to and seeks out *all*, no matter our story or situation.

So may we "stay awake" and ready in these days, encouraging all whom we know and serve of this truth. For if we are alert, living this truth daily, when the time comes, we need never be alarmed!

Finally, Friday marked **Michelle O'Connor's** last day as our Parish Secretary. I want to thank Michelle from the bottom of my heart for the dedication and care with which she has served us, over many years. Know of our deep appreciation and affection Michelle. You will be missed. On behalf of our parish, I wish you all the best and assure you of our ongoing prayers. Michelle will be at our annual Christmas party (Dec 10th), where we will have the chance to thank her more formally, please join us.

Friends, may our Advent journey be a blessed, joyous, refreshing and encouraging one.

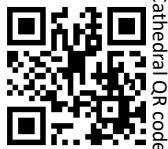

First Reading

Jer 33:14-16

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I am going to fulfil the promise I made to the House of Israel and the House of Judah: ‘In those days and at that time, I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David, who shall practise honesty and integrity in the land. In those days Judah shall be saved and Israel shall dwell in confidence. And this is the name the city will be called: The Lord-our-integrity.’

Second Reading

1 Thes 3:12 – 4:2

May the Lord be generous in increasing your love and make you love one another and the whole human race as much as we love you. And may he so confirm your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless in the sight of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus Christ comes with all his saints.

Finally, brothers, we urge you and appeal to you in the Lord Jesus to make more and more progress in the kind of life that you are meant to live: the life that God wants, as you learnt from us, and as you are already living it. You have not forgotten the instructions we gave you on the authority of the Lord Jesus.

Gospel Reading

Lk 21:25-28. 34-36

Jesus said to his disciples: ‘There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and its waves; men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world, for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.

‘Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.’
