Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

In the 40 days of Lent we journey towards the light of Easter, entering now a period of preparation. This time echoes the forty years in the desert were God's people prepared to enter the promised land - as well as the forty days Jesus spent in the desert before his public ministry. And yet, we are not simply left to wander ... and wonder! With the graced disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, our Mother the Church, accompanies us on the journey, giving us tools, as we prepare to enter and celebrate the heart of the Christian Mystery; the victory of light over darkness, hope over despair, and life over death. In these days particularly, when darkness and death seem to hold sway in so many ways, the Truth of this journeying season and the Promise of Easter in which it culminates, ring ever brighter and louder.

The image of journeying is at the heart of the Christian life. The scriptures themselves are full of journeys. We recall the story of Noah's migration, and that of Abraham. The Exodus from Egypt and the return from exile in Babylon. The story of the Holy Family, journeying to Bethlehem for the census, and then their journey into exile; into the very place which once held their ancestors as slaves. There is of course the story of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, which we will soon observe. And even today, the Emmaus journey. Indeed the whole of scripture comprises one great journeying- perhaps summed up in that of the first Adam's journey from the garden, and the returning journey which we make through the New Adam, Jesus.

Of course, a journey in its simplest form calls for change, a movement from one location to another. In this sense, it could be referred to as a dis-location. Yet within this image is revealed the truer nature of a journey. If you've ever dislocated something, you'll know how painful, and even dis -comforting it can be. In the same way the Christian life is a journeying, which is more often a dislocation. A being taken from one place to another. And while it is true to say that God never loves from a distance, it can equally be said that God never leaves us where and as we are. God always dis-locates us. Daily, he calls us to leave the place of comfort, which has perhaps become a place of indifference and spiritual languor - to leave the old ways and world behind, and to embark on the journey which promises the garden of Easter. The journey can be discomforting, even with moments of agony. Yet it is the journey which promises fullness of life.

When a person wanders, they know no purpose or direction. When they journey however, no matter the road, the twists and turns, they know the place to which they go. This is the Christian journey. We are not orphans, without identity nor destination. While 'false gods' leave us where we are, stagnant and saddened, the True God calls us, and not only calls, but journeys with us. To the cross of Calvary and soon... to the heights of Easter.

Friends, Lent is the grace filled time to move from wandering to journeying, a journey we never make alone. The 'steppingstones' by which we trek are those disciplines through which we grow in a greater love of God (prayer), a more generous love of neighbour (alms giving), and a truer love of ourselves (fasting). We recommit ourselves in these 40 days to building our lives on these three loves, so that setting out on the journey we many one day embrace its completion.

On this First Sunday of Lent the Archdiocese welcomes through the Rite of Election, those who will receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation at Easter. It marks the beginning of a period where the 'elect' (as they will soon be called) come to know Christ more deeply, surrounded by their new family in faith. We congratulate our brothers and sisters, and pledge our prayers as we continue on the great journey together.

Readings of the Day - 1st Sunday of Lent —Year B



ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.

Gospel Acclamation: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

First Reading Gen 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Second Reading 1 Pt 3:18-22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

Gospel Reading Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'
