FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

This week we have just over forty children receiving their first Holy Communions. They come from both our school of religion and from St. Bede's primary school. First Holy Communion is a beautiful moment, one of the most precious moments in our lives. We should thank God for the gift of these good children and we ought to pray for them as they grow closer to Jesus. It is also, a great opportunity for us who might be up to our thousandth or ten thousandth communion, to remember and reflect on the most precious gift that God gives us.

Mass is complicated but it gives us the greatest gift that there is.

It can feel sometimes that going to Mass is about sitting, kneeling, standing, saying the responses either too slow or too quick. We can easily feel like we don't know what to do or to say. Believing in God but not really understanding why He wants such complicated prayers.

We can feel like Mass is a chore, doing something good for God, but confusing for ourselves. I will be the very first one to say that we belong to a complicated religion, that Mass is beauti-

ful, but it is perhaps not the easiest thing to understand. Let's say what Mass is not:

Mass is not about saying that we are perfect – trust me, the people who come to Mass and try to show off or look good only ever end up embarrassing themselves.

Mass is not about pretending to have all the answers – not even the apostles knew it all. Mass is not about me or about you, it isn't even about our community either.

Mass is about Jesus. Mass is about doing what he told us to do, it is about understanding His word, and receiving Him in the Eucharist. If we are a community, we're a community because of Him.

Seeing Jesus is the key to understanding our Mass. He makes these long prayers and pauses make sense. We come to Mass to be with Him, to be faithful to what He asked us to do, to listen to His word and to learn from Him. Most important of all is our receiving Him in the Eucharist.

Here we take the very presence of God into ourselves. Even after two thousand years Jesus still makes himself present to us. God gives us everything that he can give us, He gave us his

life on the cross, and He still gives it out to us now, in the sacrifice of the Mass. He gave his disciples His body in the last supper and now He gives himself out to us here. The Mass is the closest we can get to heaven whilst still here on earth. As we take His resurrected body, it gives us the hope of sharing His eternal life.

Let us pray for our children receiving the greatest gift, and let us pray that all of us grow in deeper love and reverence of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, Fr. Alex

Let me tell you pagans this: I have been sent to the pagans as their apostle, and I am proud of being sent, but the purpose of it is to make my own people envious of you, and in this way save some of them. Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice. Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now – and only because of the mercy shown to you – will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.

Gospel

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, "Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted." And from that moment her daughter was well again.
