The Eucharist, Selflessness and Marriage

I feel like I have been speaking about two very important things for the last few months, the Eucharist, and the harm that selfishness does. Marriage is a great illustration of both of these important truths.

Selfishness is the greatest risk to a marriage. When a person becomes committed, not to their spouse, but to themselves; a marriage becomes corrupted. No longer a free and total gift of one's whole life to the person they love but something else.

Without love, marriage is terrifying.

To commit your entire life and future into the hands of another, and to shoulder the responsibility of their life and future. This is real self-sacrifice. To pledge love to another when you don't know their future.

When this commitment, the greatest of all, is entered into with mutual love, it is the most beautiful thing a person can do. But when a marriage is one-sided, it no longer reflects the love of God, instead it becomes a witness to the cruelty of man.

This is what happens when a wife submits to her husband, but he does not love her like Christ. Or when a husband submits to his wife, and she submits not to him, but to her own self.

Here we have a sense of the great love of God. Christ commits Himself to us. The truth is that Christ marries the Church. This spousal language is used all throughout the New Testament. People often say that priests marry the Church but that isn't true. A priest is only a mere groomsman. My job is to assist the bridegroom during the ceremony, to make sure attention is on Him, to give a speech before the main course of the wedding feast, and to make sure that the bride is well looked after. I am a friend and servant of the church, not her lover, it is Jesus who she gives her whole self too. Paul instructs husbands that they should take Christ's love for the Church as their model for how to love their wives. How does Christ love the Church then?

He says that the Church is his own body.

Christ gives us his own body and blood.

He commits Himself to providing a loving future for us, telling us that he's preparing a home for us.

He adopts us into his own family.

He ensures our safety, and reminds always of his love for us.

Most importantly of all, Christ promises love, fidelity, mercy, compassion and gives us his whole life.

Laying down His life for us, that we might have the fullness of life.

Christ commits His whole self to us, His body, His life, His death, His resurrection, even eternity.

Let us pray that we might be faithful to God. That we will never take the Eucharist for granted. That we will recognize everything that Jesus has done for us, and respond to His total love of us with a love of our own. We pray too for all marriages, especially those that are broken or wounded, that each and every husband and wife will in their own way witness the great truth of God's love for us. May everything we do be done for the love of God and our neighbour.

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B — 24/25 August



Entrance Antiphon: Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

Responsorial: Taste and see the goodness of the Lord

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! Your words, Lord, are spirit and life: you have the words of everlasting life. Alleluia **Communion Antiphon:** The earth is replete with the fruits of your work, O Lord; you bring forth bread from the earth and wine to cheer the heart.

First Reading Joshua 24:1-2. 15-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.' The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

Second Reading Eph 5:21-32

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

Gospel John 6:60-69

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before? 'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh that has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. 'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him. Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
