Dear parishioners and friends of St. Christopher's,

Just over one week in lockdown. I do hope you are all traveling well. We have had to adapt in many ways. Home-schooling, working from home, and for some...solo isolation. Many have commented over this past week, how 'uncertain' everything is, and they're right. This is what we seem to fear the most. The uncertain. And yet it's not just Covid. These past days have revealed again how uncertain, restless and indeed unstable life can often be. Afghanistan, Myanmar, Haiti. And then there's the dialogue over euthanasia here in the territory.

Yet for you and I – as Christians– the question amidst all of this 'uncertainty' and instability, is one of utmost importance. How often do we focus upon the *Certainty* which is ours.

We are still in the Year of Saint Joseph. And it seems divinely provident, that the Pope has chosen St. Joseph to be our model in these twelve months. We can certainly rely upon Joseph now, more than ever. In a sense, *uncertainty* was the theme of St Joseph's life. Yet he's response was always one of quite listening. We too ask, how is God speaking to me? Each day, he speaks to us in the Church, in the Mass, in the readings, in the Gospel. I encourage you to sit with the Gospel daily. Because the place of isolation and quite can also be a graced place of growth in prayer and intimacy with God. Silence can be a special form of attentiveness to God. Let us not waste this time, but use it for our spiritual growth.

This Sunday also marks, 'Australia Prays', an interdenominational initiative of Australian Christians, to prayer and fast together for an end to the Corona virus pandemic and those affected by it. On Sunday we are invited to join in prayer for this intention close to every heart. Further details can be found on page 2 of the bulletin.

Of course we continue to pray for the Covid situation here and afar. Yet our hearts and prayers turn too, with the Holy Father, to the people of **Afghanistan**, **Haiti and Myanmar**. May the Lord of peace and life have mercy on our broken and divided world.

Finally, in these days, while we can not physically be at Mass, we are invited to make an act of **Spiritual Communion**. For various reasons throughout history, faithful have been prevented from receiving the Eucharist in the Mass. Many of the great Saints however made an act of spiritual communion in these moments. Here we express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

So friends, despite the uncertainty which seem to encroach, we cling to Christ, echoing the words of the disciples in today's Gospel, "Lord, who shall we go to? You have the mes-

sage of eternal life" (Jn 6). We turn to the world's Certainty and Hope. God remains with us, indeed closer than ever. God is in our midst, because the Lord Jesus is in our midst.

Let us remain close to Jesus and each other, as the journey continues.



Readings of the Day - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

Responsorial Psalm: Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Your words, Lord, are spirit and life: you have the words of everlasting life. Alleluia! **Communion Antiphon:** The earth is replete with the fruits of your work, O Lord; you bring forth bread from the earth and wine to cheer the heart.

First Reading Jos 24:1-2. 15-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

Second Reading Eph 5:21-32

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

Gospel Reading Jn 6:60-69

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before? 'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. 'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him. Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'

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
