Dear Parishioners, and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish, Christ's question to the disciples today, is *the* question put to the Christian, daily. "Who do you say that I am?" (Mt 16:15) This question is central to the Christian life and identity, whether one recognises it or not.

Christ's question is of course a very personal one, and yet, it is not a relative one. In the original Greek (in which the Gospels were first written), the question is in fact not posed to the individual, but the group. The personal pronoun 'you' – $\lambda \hat{\epsilon} \gamma \epsilon \tau \epsilon$, in Greek – is in the plural. Jesus is asking then, the group, with a view toward a confession of unity among his first disciples. Jesus is looking for a unified answer, which is why Peter (their leader) steps forward and speaks on their behalf. And so while a relationship with Jesus is most assuredly personal, it is not relative. A follower's confession of faith is at once a personal *and* an ecclesial act. There is no Jesus simple 'for me', divided from His Body the Church.

Jesus asks His closest friends, "Who do you say I am?" Certainly, the most intriguing thing about the question however, is the *way* in which He asks or rather 'sets up' the question. He first asks more generally, "Who do people say the Son of Man is? (Mt 16:13). As if to ask: "What are other people saying about me?" We can imagine the disciples rattling off: "Some say Elijah, John the Baptist... some even just say you're a prophet!" Jesus pauses... "but you... 'who do *you* say I am?' As if to say, 'who do *you* Know Me to be? Jesus recognises, before His disciples, what the 'world' said about Him, and indeed what the world still says about Him today! He seems to say, 'ok... but now forget what the world says and thinks about me, forget what the media proffers, forget what the naysayers chant: "Who do you say that I am?' A very personal and intimate question. And how it is answered, changes everything!

Note that Jesus does not ask this at the outset when he first meets the disciples. The first encounter, rather, is an invitation: "Come, follow me" (Mtt 4:19). By the time he asks them today's question, they have already been following him, watching him, living and preaching with Him. They have established a *relationship*. And now He asks them, after they have spent so much time with him, but before his passion, death, and resurrection. Why? Because only by knowing Him will they be able to not only *endure*, but *understanding* all that is happening, and will happen in His Passion.

In these months we could be forgiven for asking, where is God in all of this? We could feel perhaps similar to the disciples in the Gospel, as they retold the common, worldly opinion many held of Jesus. Just a prophet, just a man, a role model sure, but nothing more. As we are faced by such uncertainty and darkness, as we grapple to make sense of the chaos, Jesus asks *us* the same question. Never mind the world, who do you, the Church say and know me to be? And only by honestly answering this question – are we able to not only cope with the horrors that our world can present, but able too, to make sense of how Christ has triumphed such chaos. How we answer Christ's question– changes everything. Indeed, it defines our very identity and hope, in this world. *Who do you say I am*?

> You are the light in the darkness. You are hope in despair.

You are the Son of the living God who is dwelling among us! The certainty in a world that is so uncertain. Amen.

NEW PROTOCOLS - Please familiarize yourself with current guidelines

•In accordance with government restrictions, only 100 people are permitted in the church at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.

•ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are renewed daily & destroyed after 28 days.

Gospel Reading

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell any-one that he was the Christ.
