Thoughts on Humility

Humility takes its name from the Latin word 'Hummus' which means ground, earth, soil. In English, we still use humble as a cognate for words and phrases like earthy, and down-to-earth.

In a religious sense, to be humble, is to acknowledge that we come from the ground. As Adam, the first man, was created from the earth. To be humble is to be human.

Our religion constantly tells us this; we need to be aware of our own humanity. Our readings at Mass warn us against pretension, against building ourselves up too much or telling ourselves lies. We always have to live in the truth, and the truth is that we are frail, irrational, emotional, imperfect mortals.

Humility begins when we become aware of these truths. When we are young, we think that we are indestructible, untouchable, geniuses, who will stride through life just as though we are the main character of a movie. For most of us, our own inadequacies, weaknesses, and failures will eventually catch up to us, and we will be left embarrassed and scratching our heads, wondering how we went wrong.

To be aware of our own foolishness is the first step to wisdom. We need to know that we are human, in order to know that we are not Gods.

If we think that we are God's equal, we will not learn from Him. As we heard, "There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him." The proud man will never learn from God or from his neighbours and is forever cursed to be subject to his own folly. However, if we acknowledge that we are humble creatures of the earth, then we will turn to our creator with open, docile, thankful hearts.

The humble person, isn't always happy, but by making peace with themselves, the world and God, they're in a position to accept the truth and discover God.

The proud, arrogant person is never satisfied, because he is living a lie when only the truth can satisfy us.

To be humble, isn't to be small, or ignorant; to be humble is to live in the truth.

Entrance Antiphon: Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

Responsorial: God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor.

Gospel Acclamation: Take my yoke upon you; learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart. **Communion Antiphon:** How great is the goodness, Lord, that you keep for those who fear you.

First Reading Sir 3:17-20, 28-29

My son, be gentle in carrying out your business, and you will be better loved than a lavish giver. The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord; for great though the power of the Lord is, he accepts the homage of the humble. There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him. The heart of a sensible man will reflect on parables, an attentive ear is the sage's dream.

Second Reading Heb 12:18-19,22-24

What you have come to is nothing known to the senses: not a blazing fire, or a gloom turning to total darkness, or a storm; or trumpeting thunder or the great voice speaking which made everyone that heard it beg that no more should be said to them. But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole Church in which everyone is a 'first-born son' and a citizen of heaven. You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Gospel Lk 14:1. 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
