COMFORT, SUFFERING & LOVE

Our readings touch on a matter of crucial importance to living our faith – sometimes our faith is excruciatingly hard. The prophet Jeremiah speaks from a place of great sadness; every time he hears the word of God, he howls and moans because he knows that it will cost him dearly.

Following God has caused him insult and rejection. He is grieved, he has become a social outcast, he says that he's tried to give up following God, but there's something deep in his soul that stops him. He is torn between wanting to follow men, living what this world calls a normal life, and wanting to follow God.

How often do we feel this way? How often do we hear ourselves saying that our life would be easier without God? I am sure we have all felt this way, at least once in our life.

Our Gospel gives us some hard comfort. Peter begins to tell Jesus that he should avoid his mission, and Jesus shockingly calls him Satan. He says that Peter is an obstacle, that he is thinking in the way of men and not in the way of God. Jesus tells us that to follow him, we must imitate him. We have to take up our cross and suffer as well.

Humanity thinks of comfort, God thinks of love.

God isn't cruel and wants us to suffer for the sake of causing pain. God wants us to give ourselves lovingly, which can hurt a lot. Suffering for the sake of suffering is senseless, but suffering for the sake of love is Christ-like. Peter is denounced because he wants Jesus to be comfortable, rather than to give himself fully. Giving ourselves fully, always means giving our pain, our heartbreak, our misery; indeed, if we didn't give these things we wouldn't be giving away ourselves, but a false self.

The way of the world is to hide these things, but St Paul tells us that we shouldn't model ourselves after the world, after-all what good does a comfortable life do?

We can suffer for the sake of someone we love – just think of all the hard working fathers who hardly get to see their families, or the disciplinarian dad who is hated rather than thanked.

We can suffer for the sake of love, but we can't be comfortable for a higher cause. (Trust me, if there was a way I would have found it by now). We applaud and thank those who suffer so that others might live in comfort, but those who live in comfort whilst others suffer are thought to be the lowest of the low. It is loving to comfort others, but to live in comfort is a danger to ourselves, as it is a constant temptation to idleness.

Jesus tells us that he will return and reward us according to our behaviour. He tells us to renounce ourselves, take up our crosses and follow him, and that anyone who loses their life for his sake will find it. When our faith feels hard, when we become weary of God and seek the comforts of this world, let us remind ourselves of this: that Jesus promises us through suffering we will come

to know our lives. Think of Jeremiah in heaven, how glad he must be because of his suffering, the suffering which has brought many people to love. We seek the comforts of the world but it is only the love that world cannot give which can satisfy.

First Reading Jeremiah 20:7-9

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more. Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could no bear it.

Second Reading Rom 12:1-2

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Gospel Mt 16:21-27

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? 'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'
