Correction and Criticism

Our readings leave little room for interpretation: We have a responsibility to correct each other. Ezekiel is told that he has to warn his brother who is sinning otherwise he will lose his life. Jesus tells his disciples that we ought to correct each other. However, he tells us that we ought to do it gently. Firstly, it is best to resolve problems between yourselves. If our brother does not listen to us then we should bring two or three witnesses. If this does not reconcile him, Jesus tells us, to report him to the community. If he does not listen to the community, then he is treated like a pagan or a tax collector. (It should be said this Gospel was written by a former tax collector, and Jesus, treated both of these groups with an abundance of mercy and welcome, ceaselessly hoping to bring them to heaven).

I have great news; the world has listened to Christ. It is full of criticism and correction. There truly is no shortage of criticism in our world; I type this reflection with trembling fingers anticipating an inevitable comment.

Now, this abundance of correction is not exactly a bad thing, the Bible tells us that a wise man loves correction. My question is: if there is no shortage of criticism in the world, why isn't it a better place?

Surely, the sheer volume of complaints and criticisms in this world will have brought us to a place of deep communal connection, mutual trust and understanding. It can't be the case that criticism has been dividing people, can it?

Jesus tells us to correct each other, but it is counterproductive if we don't do it well. We must obey God, but we have to pick the right opportunity to do it.

Only the very best of people will take correction from a hypocrite, always speak with integrity.

Only the most patient of people will listen to angry criticism, treat each other gently. An exhausted and overwhelmed person might not have the right frame of mind to listen and accept correction.

Constant criticism will erode a person's patience, it's best have the one hard conversation rather than fight every time you see each other.

Gilbert K. Chesterton has an excellent observation, "What embitters the world is not excess of criticism, but absence of self-criticism."

Let us pray that we might accept correction well, be gentle with each other, and may we all be led to Christ



SAINTS OF THE WEEK



Saint Oscar Romero 1917-1980 Feast: 24 March

St Oscar was born in El Salvador and learnt carpentry before becoming a priest. As Archbishop, he fearlessly preached against the civil war and murders occurring in his homeland. In a sermon on 23 March 1980, St Oscar ordered the army to stop killing people. The next day he was shot while celebrating Mass. St Oscar is a martyr - a person who gave his life for his faith in Jesus.



Saint Kateri Tekakwitha 1656-1680 Feast: 14 July

St Kateri is the first Native American canonized Saint. She grew up in the Mohawk tribe, tragically losing her whole family to smallpox at a young age. One day St Kateri met a group of Christian missionaries and truly believed what they taught. This led her to leave her tribe, but St Kateri was known as the 'Lily of the Mohawks' as she never stopped praying for her people.

Entrance Antiphon: You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

First Reading Ezekiel 33:7-9

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.'

Second Reading Rom 13:8-10

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

Gospel Mt 18:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector. 'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven. 'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'
