### **Confronting and Purifying our Desires**

St. James the Apostle makes a bold claim in our second reading, "Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires." Here is an answer to why our prayers often feel like they're unheard, however this is not the easiest answer for us to accept. We worry that it is a simplistic answer for a complex problem. We worry that it might paint a picture of God as being harsh – that He lets people suffer and does not help until they ask Him to. That picture of God doesn't square with the Jesus we see in the Gospels. However, it is a good reminder for us to pray.

St. James is speaking about desire. So much of our spiritual life hinges on our desires – We need to confront and purify our desires.

St. James tells us to pray for the things you want. If you're embarrassed to pray for the things you want, maybe it's a sign that you want something improper or maybe there's a better way to look at these desires.

Think about what you want – do you want your children to be quiet, is that not a desire for peace and a calm mind?

Do you want a supermodel to fall in love with you, and shower you with attention and bliss. Isn't that a desire for belonging, for love, for fulfilment?

You want a million dollars, so do I, do we desire wealth? Or do we simply desire freedom from poverty and its concerns?

God's answer does not always look like our question. Usually we will desire something good, but not always in a good way.

God knows what we truly need.

We must become like patients who need to understand a diagnosis before they understand how the medicine will cure them. We need to examine what we want.

St. James rightly says that this is the cause of so much wickedness in the world – these wrong desires. One nation desires security, so it robs another nation of theirs. One man desires wealth, so he takes someone else's wealth. A man desires not to work, so he makes

someone else do his work. Those who don't confront their desires will become slaves to them.

Our desires are the cause of so much mess, but they are also the key to correction. If we want to change the world we must begin by confronting and purifying our desires.

# 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B — 21/22 Sep



**Entrance Antiphon:** I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever.

First Reading Wis 2:12, 17-20

The godless say to themselves, 'Let us lie in wait for the virtuous man, since he annoys us and opposes our way of life, reproaches us for our breaches of the law and accuses us of playing false to our upbringing. Let us see if what he says is true, let us observe what kind of end he himself will have. If the virtuous man is God's son, God will take his part and rescue him from the clutches of his enemies. Let us test him with cruelty and with torture, and thus explore this gentleness of his and put his endurance to the proof. Let us condemn him to a shameful death since he will be looked after—we have his word for it.'

Second Reading James 3:16-4:3

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it also makes for peace, and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness. Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.

Gospel Mark 9:30-37

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him. They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'
