CHRISTIAN ETHICS AND RESPECT FOR LIFE

St. Paul implores us: "if our faith in Christ means anything to you ... be united in your convictions, be united in your love, have a common purpose and a common mind." This common purpose and mind we are told is to be the same as Christ.

This must be our starting point for all moral decisions.

We have to think: what would Christ want me to do. Rather than: what is easiest for me, what will make other people happy, what will be the most favourable outcome for me. This is the way that the world thinks. It is hard for us to avoid those ways of thinking when we are surrounded by them. But we can't give in, St Paul tells us, "if your faith in Christ means anything to you..." what does it say about us if we know what God wants us to do, but we feel as though it's easier or more worthwhile to do as we please or as we think someone else wants to us to act?

If we have faith it is hollow unless we act on it, our faith is empty if it doesn't challenge us to live a more godly life.

Today is Respect for Life Sunday. We reflect upon the Church's teachings, given to her by Christ, and try our best to live them out.

The Church teaches that all human life is sacred. Every person has been created in the image and likeness of God, likewise our Lord has offered his life for the salvation of every person. We thus have a divine responsibility to value and protect human life.

The measure of a life is not utility or wealth, but is given by God. Every person, no

matter how poor, how sick, how young, how elderly, how sad or depressed, is of more value than we can possibly comprehend. It is our Christian duty to serve them in this life.

God alone is the author of all life. He alone is the one who can judge its worth. On this Sunday let us pray that our faith will lead us to help our brothers and sisters, that we might become a community built on mutual love and respect for life.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK



Saint Thérèse of Lisieux 1873-1897

Feast: 1 October

St Thérèse was the youngest of nine children and had a close relationship with Jesus from a very young age. She wondered how she could do great things for Him when she was so little. God helped St Thérèse to understand that everyone, no matter how little, could surrender everything to Him in a big way. St Thérèse became a Carmelite nun and shared her 'little way' with the world in her memoir.



Saint Maximilian Kolbe 1894—1941

Feast: 14 August

St Maximilian was a priest devoted to our Blessed Mother and spreading the Word of God. He established the Immaculata Movement, forming a community in Poland and travelling to Japan and India. During World War II, St Maximilian returned to Poland, hiding people from the Nazis, and maintaining an underground radio station witnessing to Christ. St Maximilian was sent to a concentration camp, where he volunteered to die in the place of another prisoner.


Job Opportunity: Caritas Australia Diocesan Director for Canberra and Goulburn

Entrance Antiphon: All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgment, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But you give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy. *Responsorial:* Remember your mercies, O Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!
Communion Antiphon: Remember your word to your servant, O Lord, by which you have given me hope. This is my comfort when I am brought low.

First Reading

Ezekiel 18:25-28

Phil 2:1-11

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.'

Second Reading

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus: His state was divine, yet he did not cling to he equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and because as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'

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Mt 21:28-32
