St Peter Chanel's: By arrangement

In today's parable, two kinds of people are described; both are imperfect and unworthy but the one who obeyed finally is better than the first one. The First one promises little but performs better. Though he is apparently hard-hearted, he is ultimately generous. The second person professes one thing and does another and his promise is nothing but lip service. However, some people are outwardly irreligious but they are closer to God than those who are 'God-fearing'. The truly good person practices what he professes. His deeds conform to his words. Primarily Jesus addressed this parable to the chosen people of God, the Israelites. They said 'Yes' to God's covenant but they did not keep their word, whereas the tax-collectors and sinners knew they were on the wrong path but tried to reform their ways to obey God. Thus, what is important is repentance, conversion and change of heart. These things lead to God's kingdom. As Jesus says that 'no' need not be the final answer. We must rather learn to say 'yes' to others and to God. But do we really say 'yes' to the downtrodden, sinners and those who are in need? Do we say 'yes' to ourselves in carrying out our responsibilities in obedience to God? Of course, sometimes we are failed, and we need an inner conversion, so that we may come out from our 'no' to 'yes' to the heavenly Father. For that, we need a spiritual renewal, repentance and conversion of heart. Our attitude must be that of Jesus Christ who emptied him-

self for our sins, saying 'yes' to God even unto death, death on the cross. Therefore, if we want say 'Yes' to the Will of God, then we need to show our inner conversion and person renewal. At the end our inner conversion and person renewal alone can bring about a renewal in the Church, in our society and in this world.

RCIA is the process through which those who have an interest in the Catholic faith may explore the possibility of becoming Catholic. Notice about Covid-19 Restrictions: Thank you too all who have consistently adhered to the Covid-19 protocols in our parish and Archdiocese. We are enabled to continue our prayer and worship because of your care and attention to this. Please ensure you continue to **sanitise your hands frequently** and **wipe your pew upon exiting**.

St Peter Chanel's garden refurbishment – coming together in a community project—During last year's heatwave and drought, it became obvious to those parishioners who were watering the garden that more plants were dead than alive. So we have enlisted the services of a landscape architect (Paul Barisic-Bentley, former St Peter Chanel's student) who has drawn up a simple, attractive garden plan (displayed near the church entrance) that should be easy to maintain (this plan has been financed by a parishioner). NEW PROTOCOLS - Please familiarize yourself with current guidelines

- In accordance with government restrictions, **only 100 people** are permitted in the church at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are renewed daily & destroyed after 28 days.
- All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- Communion is to be received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 4sqm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. NB: Families can sit together.
- Please use the hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided at entrances.
- There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates to be passed around, but money/envelopes placed at collection points.
- Please DO NOT return your bulletin to the basket, if you are not taking it home put it in the bin.

Please maintain social distancing 1.5m, at all times, including in the single line formed to receive Holy Communion. Blue squares on the tiles mark this distance. Thank you for your assistance in keeping everyone safe.

Readings of the Day – 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: *All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgement, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.*

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Remember your mercies, O Lord.*

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!*

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: *Remember your word to your servant, O Lord, by which you have given me hope. This is my comfort when I am brought low.*

First Reading

Ez 18:25-28

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: ‘You object, “What the Lord does is unjust.” Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.’

Second Reading

Phil 2:1-11

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people’s interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus: His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Reading

Mt 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, ‘What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, “My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today.” He answered, “I will not go,” but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, “Certainly, sir,” but did not go. Which of the two did the father’s will?’ ‘The first’ they said. Jesus said to them, ‘I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.’
