Synod on Synodality – October 4 to 29, 2023

Friends, the Pope has called a *Synod on Synodality*, and after much preparation the first gathering is now underway in Rome. The second is set for October 2024.

The word *Synod* comes from the Greek meaning 'meeting.' Yet this particular Synod is unique, in that *all* of the Baptised are represented to listen and discern together, not just the Bishops, as the Apostle's successors, as in synod gatherings in the past.

Our own Archdiocese, as a part of the Universal Church has also been journeying towards this gathering for some years now. Last year, in the *Year of Walking Together*, we focused on the image of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

They had all but lost hope after Jesus' death, yet in this moment Jesus appears in their midst and joins them. At first, he goes unrecognised, however His Presence is deeply felt in the 'journeying'. The disciples later reflect: "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road?" (Lk 24:32).

This Synod and its process then, at its heart, is a potent reminder of who the Church is, made up of *all* the Baptised. We have come from God, we are moving towards God, and God is with us, speaking to us, as we walk along the way. It is a privileged and significant moment to listen to *what the Holy Spirit is saying to us,* the Church, in our times.

The Gospel today powerfully lends itself to this truth, with a warning! In it we hear that the tenets want to 'grab' the vineyard and its fruits for their own. Indeed they neglect and reject the prophetic voices, and even kill the Son himself... The tenets avoid their responsibility and duty with the owner, and instead, ejecting the owner, attempt to take the vineyard for themselves and their own purposes. This is precisely what the Synod is not!

In the Gift of baptism we are all called to serve the *whole* Body as living members.

A focus in the Archdiocesan Year of the Holy Spirit (Aug 2023-Aug 2024) has been discerning the Charisms given to us by the Holy Spirit for the service of others. These are not 'talents', but Godgiven and directed Gifts, for the building up not of ourselves, but the Church. Synodality, at its core, refers to the communion and participation of all the members of the Church in the mission of evangelization. Each of us, accepting the grace of being God's children, shares intimately in call to evangelisation in and through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

To assist us to receive this transforming current of grace of the Holy Spirit, our parish will soon gather in what we have called, "evangelisation circles" of prayer and listening. How do we - journeying with the Synod in Rome and in our own parishes - answer the Baptismal call to evangelisation? What are the 'charisms' God has given to me to serve my brothers and sisters and so glorify God here and now?

Let us pray deeply for and with the Synod over these weeks, and so rediscover our baptismal mandate to evangelisation and joy, breathing and witnessing daily the Living Gospel of Life, Hope and Love.

First Reading

Isaiah 5:1-7

Phil 4:6-9

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Second Reading

There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learnt from me and have been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you.

Gospel

Mt 21:33-43 Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
