ST. TIMOTHY AND PERSEVERANCE

A rough beginning does not mean that a life is not worth living. Our readings this weekend reflect on the need for perseverance and hope.

Consider our second reading; it comes from Paul's second letter to Timothy. Now, Timothy is something of an unsung hero in the Church. He was born to a Greek father and Jewish mother, and grew up in Lystra or Derbe in Lycaonia, Anatolia. Timothy was introduced to the faith by St. Paul; he may have been a witness to a miracle which happened there when Paul and Barnabas healed a man crippled from birth.

Timothy becomes something of a disciple to St. Paul, accompanying him on his later journeys. He is mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, and many of St. Paul's letters, in fact he is mentioned as the coauthor of seven of them. Timothy is ordained a bishop by Paul, and ministers to many of the churches founded by Paul.

Paul's Second Letter to Timothy was written just prior to St. Paul's death; Paul expected to die, and must have struggled with worry and anxiety about what would happen to the Church. He foresees a lot of trouble, division and persecution in the future, and so he encourages Timothy with our second reading. Our presence here today shows that Paul and Timothy's sacrifices were not in vain.

Our faith has not come to us by accident, or happenstance. The faith has come to us through hard work, sacrifice, and the perseverance of the saints. We are the product of two thousand years of good people carrying their crosses and following Christ. Imagine how happy would they be to see you, the fruit of their prayers and works. Have hope that one day we will meet them in heaven.

When we face hardship in our own times, let us pray for patience and perseverance, inspired by the example of the saints and martyrs we place our hope and trust in heaven and not on earth.

Entrance Antiphon: Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

Responsorial: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Gospel Acclamation: The word of the Lord stands for ever; it is the word given to you, the Good News.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

First Reading Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes. Then the Lord answered and said, 'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

Second Reading 2 Tm 1:6-8,-13-14

I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God. Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

Gospel Lk 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you. 'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."
