#### What is heaven like? And how do we get there?

You can tell a lot about a person by how they imagine heaven. When a person is trying to describe heaven, they usually reveal the things that are most important to them, as well as showing us an insight into their image of who God is. For example, many people describe heaven in terms of the family they will be re-united with, and we see that they love, and deeply miss, their family. Others might describe heaven as a place of getting the answers or seeing everything, and we see that they deeply care about the truth, learning, and they see God as the source of answers. Give it a try yourself and you'll get an insight into what you value most.

The Bible describes heaven in many ways, there's no perfect analogy for heaven, so it's very useful to us that the Bible gives us a few images. Sometimes heaven is shown to be a throne-room, sometimes a temple, other times something so high up we cannot see it. Our readings talk of heaven as a feast. The feast, a wedding feast to be exact, reveals a lot to us:

Heaven is communal, there are many people there, it isn't just you and God, our neighbours, our community are there too.

- These people in heaven are celebrating.
- They are lively and joyful.
- There is a great abundance.
- Death is destroyed.

Every tear is wiped from our cheeks.

Heaven is a marriage, between the Son of the Father and his Bride - the Church.

The guests to the wedding feast have come because they love God and are loved by him.

This is really the heart of the gospel. Many are called, but few are chosen. God loves everyone, but not everyone loves God in return. It is only those who love God who will make the effort to come. We see this when the King calls out to the first guests and amazingly they have other stuff to do!

Rather than go to the son's wedding, they'd prefer to milk the cows. Some even hate the king, and kill his servants. These people do not love God -- they hate him. The others are at best they are indifferent - they love their cows but not their king. We see that it is not God who refuses them, but they refuse to come. God does not condemn people to hell; we condemn ourselves by our own choices.

We see illustrated further in the episode of the man attending the party without a wedding garment. I used to think that this was unfair, but the Bible never says that the man was too poor to buy a wedding garment or that he doesn't own one already. When the king asks the man why he isn't wearing one, he says nothing. He's come to the wedding but he isn't celebrating. The king is perfectly at rights to throw him out. We can't passively celebrate, just as we can't passively love.

How do we get to heaven?

The first step is wanting to go.

## SAINTS OF THE WEEK



Saint Zelie Martin 1831-1877 Saint Louis Martin 1823-1894 Feast: 12 July

Saints Zelie and Louis both had a strong devotion to their faith, with each of them unsuccessfully seeking to enter religious life. St Louis went onto become a watchmaker, while St Zelie was a lacemaker. They met one day while walking across a bridge in opposite directions. On passing St Louis, St Zelie heard God tell her this is the man she would marry. They had nine children, with all five of their surviving

daughters, including St Thérèse of Lisieux, entering religious life. Saints Zelie and Louis are the first spouses to be canonized as a couple.

#### **First Reading**

## Isaiah 25:6-10

On this mountain, the Lord of hosts will prepare for all people a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, of food rich and juicy, of fine stained wines. On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek; he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth for the Lord has said so. That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hope for salvation; the Lord is the one in whom we hoped. We exult and we rejoice that he has saved us; for the hand of the Lord rests on this mountain.

## Second Reading

#### Phil 4:12-14. 19-20

I know how to be poor and I know how to be rich too. I have been through my initiation and now I am ready for anything anywhere: full stomach or empty stomach, poverty or plenty. There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength. All the same, it was good of you to share with me in my hardships. In return my God will fulfil all your needs, in Christ Jesus, as lavishly as only God can. Glory to God, our Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

## Gospel

#### Mt 22:1-14

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
