

I've often wondered why certain accounts are recorded in scripture, while others are left out? Granted... we are told "if everything [Jesus did] were written down...the world itself could not contain the books that would need to be written" (Jn 21:25). But why these particular stories?

This weekend we hear the conversation between Jesus and a 'wealthy man', who remains nameless; as if he stands in the place of any of us. And his life portrays a deep, formative truth about the Christian.

As Jesus set out on a journey, the man eagerly approaches and asks: Good teacher. What must I do, to share in Everlasting Life? He hungers for more, for fullness, for life. And yet, think about it. He's rich!! He has all he needs materially, and more. But...beyond all this, there remains a desire – the most basic, abiding, and yearning of desires, not for anything this world can give.

He seeks a life of fullness and peace; all the human heart longs for, whether consciously or not. *That's* what he seeks. Furthermore, he knows where to find it, running to Jesus, Goodness itself, objectively present before him.

Jesus tells him, follow the commandments. As if to say here are certain things that you need to cut out of your life if you're going to live in friendship with God. The man has kept them; a firm foundation on which to build. But now Jesus 'looked steadily at him and loved him'. Following the commands has made him *fit*, in the spiritual sense... now a life of true intimacy and friendship with God may begin. Jesus invites the man to more; as if to say: I don't just want you healthy, I want you flourishing! For you are made for more! You are now ready to imitate Love, not just to get by, but to imitate God Himself. And God is One who gives Himself away in Love.

What stands in the way? What things do we cling to, habits which we 'hoarded' for our security? Give it away! Jesus says. As God gives His Own Being away. Live for the other.

Today, the world, in all its beauty and splendour, its graced advances in technology and wisdom, its wealth of goods at beck and call, still yearns for more... and continually asks: 'is this it?' We yearn for more love, more truth, more joy. Yet to truly experience such, we must be brave enough to not just do "the basics" (the Commandments), but now to go further, to be spiritually stretched from a world centred on the self, and to now imitate God, a God who is love. And that stretching at first can be painful.

Perhaps it all sounds too demanding? This is precisely what the disciples said, later alone with Jesus. To which he honestly replied, *yes*, for human beings "it is impossible but not for God: because everything is possible for God.' Jesus invites us to more, to become like God, a God who is love, and love does not hoard for itself, but gives itself away. This invitation is given to you and I now, in the midst of a world yearning for more, besieged by the pandemics of the world and the human heart.

Jesus today reminds us and leaves us with a truth. It wasn't the money that hindered the rich young man, but the self-sufficiency. We are daily invited to become like God, which means being imbued by love itself, living for the other. And only when we pursue this, do we begin to enter into deep friendship with God and the promise of eternal life. Indeed, this is the Wisdom spoken of in our first readings, of which the author admits, '...compared with Her, all Gold is a pinch of sand'.

First Reading Wis 7:7-11

I prayed, and understanding was given me; I entreated, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me. I esteemed her more than sceptres and thrones; compared with her, I held riches as nothing. I reckoned no priceless stone to be her peer, for compared with her, all gold is a pinch of sand, and beside her silver ranks as mud. I loved her more than health or beauty, preferred her to the light, since her radiance never sleeps. In her company all good things came to me, at her hands riches not to be numbered.

Second Reading Heb 4:12-13

The word of God is something alive and active; it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely: it can slip through the place where the soul is divided from the spirit, or joints from the marrow; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts. No created thing can hide from him; everything is uncovered and open to the eyes of the one to whom we must give account of ourselves.

Gospel Reading Mk 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'

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
