Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish,

"Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world..."

These well know lines penned by the 16th Century Saint and Carmelite nun, Teresa of Avila (1515-1582), form a prayer which captures the tangible, physical nature of what it is to be Christian; what it is to truthfully bear the Name. They are unmistakable in their assertion, and sharp in their command–the Christian life is dynamic and active: it is a life which changes us, and has its affect on the people and world in which we exist. The Christian is called to be salt and light (Matt 5:13-16), living out Christ's life, embracing the goodness which comes from Him alone and thus revealing God's steadfast love to all they encounter, especially in times of darkness.

I could not help but call to mind Saint Teresa's prayer this past week. This parish is so generous! Last weekend we collected over \$3,000 for those affected by the bushfires. The love, generosity and practical support that you have shown these families during their time of crisis is immense. On their behalf: I thank you! Individual donations this week have also been breathtakingly generous, some up to \$5,000!

The greatest solidary that has been shown however are the prayers offered, both privately and as a community. For three weeks now prayer vigils have been held in our parish, pieced together and lead by members of our wonderful parish and Legion of Mary group. I am so grateful for the initiative, love and leadership of so many in our community in these days. Our prayers vigils will continue for fir victims and those of the continuing drought.

In many ways, and most effectively through prayer, we become instruments of God, allowing those around to discover that God does care, and permitting them to once more be pervaded by His tender love. This is the Christian life manifest, and of which Saint Teresa wrote.

In a world which so desperately searches for God and so often struggles in doing so, we see that God *is* merciful, loving, and close; and so many are able to see proof of this love, revealed through you! One affected parishioner from the coast remarked – "I've never felt the church more a family than now. We feel so loved!"

I know that our support will continue well after the flames are gone! And that's what give so many families so much hope: knowledge that they are not alone nor forgotten.

Let us continue to pray for all suffering in these days in any way, that *Jesus* may be their consolation and solace. And let us pray for each other, that we may continue to be conduits of that love which *Jesus*, the Prince of peace, is, every day, revealing to the world.

Gospel Reading

Seeing Jesus coming towards him, John said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. This is the one I spoke of when I said: A man is coming after me who ranks before me because he existed before me. I did not know him myself, and yet it was to reveal him to Israel that I came baptising with water.' John also declared, 'I saw the Spirit coming down on him from heaven like a dove and resting on him. I did not know him myself, but he who sent me to baptise with water had said to me, "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit." Yes, I have seen and I am the witness that he is the Chosen One of God.'
