Divine Mercy Sunday

On this 2nd Sunday of Easter, with the joy of the Resurrection still fresh in our minds and hearts, the Church celebrates *Divine Mercy Sunday*. Saint John Paul II announced this day, not long before his death. Karol Wojtyla (later John Paul II) had fostered a devotion to Sister Faustina— a polish nun who died in 1938. Sister Faustina was gifted with visions of the Risen Lord; the culmination coming when Jesus revealed His Sacred Heart, from which burst forth rays of light. You might recall the image of *Divine Mercy*, where from Jesus heart radiates a *pail white*, identifying baptism, and *red*, signifying the Eucharist and Christ's Blood.

But what do we mean by mercy? The word comes from the Latin *Misericordia*, which expresses a suffering of the heart. *Misereri* meaning 'to have pity on', or compassion for, and *cor*, meaning heart. Mercy then is a type of compassion (in Latin *compassionis* means "to suffer with"). Mercy signifies therefore how God draws our misery into his own loving heart. This idea echoes what the Old Testament expressed as God's *hesed*, or tender mercy. In the psalm this weekend we hear:

"Let the house of Israel say,
"His love endures forever."
Let the house of Aaron say,
"His love endures forever."
Let those who fear the LORD say,
"His love endures forever."

God's divine love endures forever, never to be taken away, never to dim. Indeed, it's no coincidence that this psalm rings out today, as the world remains submerged in the confusion and agony of pandemic.

In today's Gospel we see the very human encounter with the Risen Jesus. The disciples are gathered, locked behind closed doors, *in fear*! Those who only a week ago in the moment of truth had denied and abandoned their Master, huddle, paralysed by their experienced. But now, Jesus comes and stands among them. He's back! Yet not for some kind of payback, but rather, with words of peace: "Peace be with you!"

Astonishingly, Jesus then draws attention to his wounds... why? Lest they forget! Lest we forget what the world has done to him. Lest they forget the reality of sin. Yet note he does not then follow with a word of retribution...but of *Mercy*.

These weeks after Easter are always a strange time, but in these days, when covid still burdens our world, they can feel even stranger! A lot of the time we subconsciously think 'ok, we're done with Easter', and while it's not 'back to normal', we still think, Easter is 'over for another year'. Yet while we think like this, we run the risk of carry on and living as if the Resurrection never happened; along with the truth and mercy which flows from it

A few years ago, at a Passion play, a kindergarten class re-enacted the Resurrection and Empty Tomb. They did a great job! However, there was one little boy (the angel) who was given the critical line to deliver to the young girls who would come to the tomb and find it empty. "He's is not here, He is Risen..." When the time come however, he was silent, struck with stage fright. His teacher leant over and whispered the line. After a pause, he whispered into the microphone... "He's not here. He is in prison!"

How often do we subconsciously act as if *this* is the line delivered by the angel... that Christ rose, fine... but now, somehow, the merits of this Resurrection, the grace of this miracle, the transformative reality that this event... is all restrained behind some prison of our own fear and uncertainty?

Today Christ shows his Wounds – and in so doing he points to *our wounds* – the wounds that won us such a revelation of Mercy and Love from God! *Misericordia* (Mercy) – God shares in our woundedness, and see how his wounds are now transformed! Our wounds become his, and his wounds become glorified. So much so that our wounds, the wounds of the church, become the pathway to God!

On this weekend of *Divine Mercy*, we pause... and we begin to realise once more that we're not bound nor imprisoned by our woundedness. But rather, *we're freed*, when our wounds are recognised in the light of the risen Jesus! In these days we are closer to God than ever. Closer to the God who has taken our very flesh and destroyed that death which once had claim over us. The great invitation that is given to us in these days, is exactly that, the invitation to *live as People who know the Resurrection happened*, and who are now changed! Who now embrace and bathe in the merits of that Miracle and Fount of Mercy.

"Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed" that is, "look at the wounds that once pierced them... they are not wounds anymore and nor are yours!"

May God draw close to you in these mysteriously joyful Easter days... He is with you, and through His Church, He is close.

Readings of the Day – 2nd Sunday of Easter —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alle-

Responsorial Psalm: Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy are those who have

not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing, alleluia.

First Reading Acts 4:32-35

The whole group of believers was united, heart and soul; no one claimed for his own use anything that he had, as everything they owned was held in common. The apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus with great power, and they were all given great respect. None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them, to present it to the apostles; it was then distributed to any members who might be in need.

Second Reading 1 Jn 5:1-6

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God; and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets. We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith. Who can overcome the world? Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.

Gospel Reading Jn 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.' 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
