#### **CHRIST'S TRANSFIGURATION**

This second Sunday of Lent we experience Christ's Transfiguration, a moment rich in mystery, now penetrating the material realm. The moment comes at a crucial time in the journey of the disciples, as Jesus' death approaches. It is, believe it or not, a 'Lenten moment', of preparation and strengthening. Yet it is also a crucial time for us, in our own journey, and especially of late in our broken, dishevelled world.

Jesus takes his disciple up the mountain to unveil his divinity, but momentarily. Here He reminds and encourages them of how close the Divine really is; especially when it seems he seems most distant. He also reveals to their minds and hearts, that it is in *this* relationship, that they will endure and indeed flourish, amid all that awaits them.

Jesus reveals a depth dimension to His existence, not visible to the naked eye, yet always entirely present. Divinity now dwelling perfectly in humanity. In this moment, Jesus heartens the disciples 'take courage!', as if to comfortingly remind them: *I am* (and will always be) with you!

This reminder on the mount is needed more than ever. In a world torn by war and pride, by sin and indifferentism, things are not what they seem – when all appears to be lost – when the "chips are down", when God seems more wishful thinking and more distant than ever.... Christ whispers a warning... "do not be fooled. I am closer and more aware of all that is going on than you might first think".

It is significant that the Transfiguration occurs at a critical moment in the life of the disciples – right before Jesus' passion. His closest friends are about the encounter great suffering and a demoralizing disorder. Indeed, some might even question if God was with them, or worse, if Jesus was in fact God at all!

Yet the Lord knows this and so seeks to strengthen the apostles' *faith* in anticipation of all that lay ahead. While there is suffering, pain, and doubt, *I am here*, He says. The ascent onto the 'high mountain' so prepares us, for the ascent to Calvary.

At every Mass the Transfiguration takes place and God reveals His presence in the world. At the elevation of the Host we glance upon the Divinity dwelling in what to many, merely appears human and material. When we realise this, we see that the Mass is everything. How could we possible keep away? For a brief moment we glimpse and make sense again of the mire of woundedness we find ourselves in; just like the disciples in the wake of the Passion.

Jesus is Life in the midst of darkness, and He is Hope and Joy in the midst of all which attempts rob us of both.

### 2nd Sunday of Lent Year C — 12/13 March



**Entrance Antiphon:** Of you my heart has spoken, Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is my light and my salvation

Gospel Acclamation: From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him.

Communion Antiphon: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.

First Reading Gen 15:5-12. 17-18

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified. 'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off. Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with in Abraham in these terms: 'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

### **Second Reading**

# Phil 3:20-4:1 (Longer version Phil 3:17-4:1)

For us, our homeland is in heaven, and from heaven comes the saviour we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. He will do that by the same power with which he can subdue the whole universe. So then, my brothers and dear friends, do not give way but remain faithful in the Lord. I miss you very much, dear friends; you are my joy and my crown.

Gospel Lk 9:28-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' – He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
