THE TRANSFIGURATION AND THE TRUE MEANING OF SUFFERING

This Second Sunday of Lent, our liturgy is centred on the Transfiguration. Jesus allows the disciples Peter, James and John a foretaste of the glory of the Resurrection: a glimpse of heaven on earth. They go up the mountain with their Master, they see Him immersed in prayer and, then "His face shone like the sun". This must have been an overwhelming shock, they saw the glory of God. And then, Moses and Elijah appear beside Jesus and speak with. It is a preview of Easter. We see the dead raised to life, Elijah who was brought to heaven in a fiery chariot remains in the presence of God, and returns as was prophesied, Moses who was unable to see God face to face on a different mountain, adores the fullness of God's glory.

Peter shouts out: "Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here". He and the others see Jesus as He truly is and are standing in the midst of heaven. Why does Our Lord show them this? He tells them to stand up and not be afraid, and then orders them not to tell anyone until He has risen from the dead. Jesus is doing this to prepare them for His passion, He knows that they will not understand the cross, but they might understand the hope of heaven. He shows them their destination, because their journey is unimaginably hard. This is the way for all of us too, we need hope in order to carry the weight of our crosses. Without hope, our faith is suffocated.

The Transfiguration shows us the true meaning of suffering. Suffering is not sadomasochism: it is a necessary but temporary passage. It will end, and it will bring us to something which never ends. Our destination, our goal, our hope is the luminous, bright, heavenly face of Jesus. Our company is Moses and Elijah and all the saints. By revealing his glory in this way, Jesus shows us that the cross, our trials, our difficulties are resolved and overcome in Easter.

So this Lent, let us pray that we can let His light illuminate our darkness. Fr. Alex

• The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. In Lent, we omit the "Alleluia" at Mass.

First Reading

Gen 12:1-4

The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing. 'I will bless those who bless you: I will curse those who slight you. All the tribes of the earth shall bless themselves by you.' So Abram went as the Lord told him.

Second Reading

2 Tim 1:8-10

Mt 4:1-11

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
