The Year of Saint Joseph

Friends, we are now well into celebrating the *Year Saint Joseph*, which began on the 8th of December 2020 and runs through until the 8th of December 2021. And at what a beautiful time it has arrived! The world in all its turmoil and uncertainly, now wisely turns its gaze to Saint Joseph and thus to Jesus. In his Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde* (*With a Father's Heart*), which commemorates the 150th anniversary of Saint Joseph being formally recognised as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis reminds us of the "man in the shadows". The personification of humility, Joseph goes "unnoticed", and yet plays one of the greatest roles in salvation history. Joseph is the protector and provider of the Holy Family, of God who has become incarnate, vulnerable, and exposed to a harsh and dangerous world.

Pope Francis has called the year, that "every member of the faithful, following [Joseph's] example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfilment of God's will." Joseph is a man who, despite the doubt and hurdles which presented themselves, in the great mystery of the Incarnation, opened his heart to the Mystery - not treating it as a problem to be solved, but truly learning to live in the mystery. Is this not the invitation to each and every Christian? Is Joseph not the model of listening, courage, faith and finally, trust, for every Christian in response to God's call? The same call which comes to the ears of Samuel in today's first reading.

Amazingly, within Scripture itself, Joseph, the husband of Mary, has no words of his own recorded. He was not mute, nor was he chastised as Zechariah was in Luke (1:20), nor was he even under a vow of silence. And yet... nothing. There is but one Word which Joseph most certainly uttered and of which scripture confirms. Matthew's Gospel recounts how after the Annunciation, an angel appears to Joseph in a dream:

"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife...She will bear a son, and you are to name him *Jesus*, ... When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, ...and he named him *Jesus*' (Matt 1:18-25)

The Name above every other Name (Phil 2:9), the Name which brings peace and truth. How we need this Name spoken in every corner of the world in our days. Saint Joseph uttered many things, hidden from our ears, but the one, necessary Word we know Joseph most certainly did utter was: *Jesus*. This Name is the sum total proclamation of St. Joseph's life. The greatest prayer the human heart can invoke. May it be so for us as too; this day and every day of our lives.

PRESENT PROTOCOLS - Please be familiar with current guidelines

First Reading 1 Sm 3:3-10.19

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place. The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.' Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

Second Reading 1 Cor 6:13-15. 17-20

The body is not meant for fornication; it is for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. God, who raised the Lord from the dead, will by his power raise us up too. You know, surely, that your bodies are members making up the body of Christ; anyone who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him. Keep away from fornication. All the other sins are committed outside the body; but to fornicate is to sin against your own body. Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, which is in you since you have received him from God. You are not your own property; you have been bought and paid for. That is why you should use your body for the glory of God.

Gospel Reading Jn 1:35-42

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' – which means Teacher – 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' – which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' – meaning Rock.
