On this second Sunday of Lent we experience a moment rich in mystery. It is a moment which comes at a vital point in the journey for the disciples, as the crucifixion approaches. With all the last year has revealed for us, perhaps we can say that it comes at an equally crucial time in our own journey.

Taking his disciple up the mountain, Jesus unveils his divinity, yet it is only for a moment, a moment in which he reminds and encourages his disciples of how close God (how close the divine) really is; especially when seeming most distant! In this intimate moment Jesus echoes, that *in* this relationship alone, not only will they endure all the trials to come, but they will be able to make sense of all that awaits them.

As a hospital chaplain I met the Glira family, whose 6 year old son Matteo was undergoing an intense retina treatment. Each day for 40 days this brave little boy received treatment, part of which required both his eyes to be covered for days at a time. The patches used however, were removed every few days, giving Matteo a short, yet euphoric, glimpse of his mum. Matteo's mum was with him 24/7, holding his hand, speaking to him, feeding and bathing him. He knew she was there, but to see her—that changed everything!

I was present one morning when Matteo's patches were changed. At the glance of his mother's face, his eyes lit-up... it was as if all the pain, agony and *isolation* of the last three days were washed away in a torrent of blissful awe and comfort—the one who made sense of everything... again showed her loving, reassuring face. A glimpse is all it took. What a profoundly human thing to experience, and something I will never forget.

In today's gospel, Jesus reveals but for a brief moment, a depth dimension to his existence, that had not been visible to the naked eye, and yet was certainly always present! Jesus revealed his divinity dwelling perfectly in his humanity and in so doing reminded them, and us, to 'take courage!' as if to comfortingly prompt them: I am and will always be with you! The divine is dwelling in the midst of the human.

This too is a reminder to us—that things are not always what they seem—when all appears to be lost, when the "chips are down", when God seems more wishful thinking and more distant than ever, Christ whispers a warning: "do not be fooled. I am closer and more aware of all that is going on than you might first think".

The Transfiguration came at a specific time for the disciples—they were to endure a great suffering, which might cause them to question if God was with them, or worse if Jesus was in fact God at all. This moment however strengthens their faith in anticipation. That while there is suffering, while there is pain and confusion, and even doubt... 'I am there'. The ascent up the 'high mountain' then, is preparing them for the ascent to Calvary.

And then there is Peter, who is often ridiculed for his response to the dazzling episode. But is this fair? For the Jewish people, to speak of a tabernacle or tent, promptly recalled the image of the tent in the desert, where the ark of the covenant was kept, the Holy of Holies where the pilgrim people worshiped. This was the place where God dwelt among his people. So what is Peter perhaps saying? Let's build a tent! Why? Because this is where God is dwelling. He recognises God's presence, the Divine in their midst!

Matteo had a moment very similar to the disciples. It was only a glimpse –yet it was a glimpse that strengthen and placed him on the courageous road once more. A glimpse is all he needed, to know that the joy of his heart was always with him, even in the darkness. He was not alone.

On our Lenten journey, and indeed during such a traumatic time for so many around the world, this image rings true once more. *God is with us.* In this season we deny and discipline our senses though our Lenten practises, that they may become more acutely aware and sharpened to this magnificent truth. Every Mass, this same Transfiguration takes place, God reveals His presence in the world. At the elevation of the Host we *glance* upon the divine dwelling in what merely appears human (the Bread) – and just for a brief period all can make sense again.

A blessed Lenten journey, Fr Trenton

First Reading Gen 22:1-2. 9-13. 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.' When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son. The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of your enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Second Reading Rom 8:31-34

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us – he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

Gospel Reading Mk 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
