THE PHARISEES AND THE PEOPLE JESUS DOES NOT GET ANGRY WITH

Here is a controversial opinion. I sympathise with the Pharisees. They get a terrible reputation, Our Lord is angry with them in just about every other chapter of the Gospels. Their purpose as a group seems to be quite noble – after the return from exile the Pharisees are the teachers and scholars of Judaism, preserving their people's knowledge and identity. Truly, we ought to thank them for preserving the Old Testament for us.

At the heart of this movement, the Pharisees are only trying to do the will of God, and to understand their religion. If they are a good movement, something that was inspired by God and devoted to understanding him, why is Our Lord so angry with them?

There is a list of people I would be angry with, before I would get cross with the Pharisees. Firstly, Herod, Our Lord barely mentions Herod, and yet he murders Jesus' cousin John the Baptist out of pointless pride. Our Lord does not take revenge.

Our Lord does not complain much about the religious followers of Herod, the Herodians, who neglected the truth for the sake of politics. The worst thing He says about them is to lump them in with the Pharisees. Our Lord does not engage in their politics.

Likewise, the Jews who abandoned their faith and followed the Pagan Gods, as it suited their interests. Our Lord does not denounce them in the Gospels. Nor does Our Lord complain about the Jews who turned on their countrymen, those who assisted the foreign occupiers. In fact, Our Lord even recruits one of these tax collectors as an apostle.

Perhaps most shockingly of all, Jesus does not denounce the Romans, they've invaded his country, killed many, in their own way they have been responsible for the other parties. Jesus knows that he will be tied to a Roman cross and pierced with a Roman lance, at the orders of the Roman governor but Our Lord treats them with respect and never denounces them. Our Lord accepts his death for the sake of the salvation of many.

When we look at the groups of people Jesus does get angry with, we see something important. They are the Pharisees, the Apostles (especially Peter, never individually at Judas), and the worshippers in the Temple. Our Lord is angry with those who ought to understand him. The Pharisees enrage Him so much, because they are so close to the truth, but they can't live up to it.

This explains the first part of today's Gospel, Our Lord warns the Apostles not be like the Pharisees -- selfish, attention seeking, good-for-nothings, who are worse than useless because they make problems worse, they help no one. Our Lord says that the disciples must listen to them, and amazingly, that we must do what they say. We see Our Lord respects what the Pharisees should be.

Our Lord is angry with those He is close to, in this way the anger of God, the pricking of our consciences, should be a sign of blessing and favour. If Our Lord did not care for us, he would not waste His time on us. Jesus uses his anger to lead others to love.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla 1922-1962

Feast: 28 April

St Gianna grew up in a Catholic family, and from a young age saw life as a beautiful gift from God. She studied medicine and became a paediatrician. St Gianna married Pietro Molla and they had four children. During her final pregnancy, it was discovered that she had cancer. She chose a treatment that would save her child, dying a

week after her daughter was born.



Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati 1901-1925

Feast: 4 July

From a young age, Blessed Pier Giorgio had a strong faith and desire to help others. At 17, he joined the St Vincent de Paul Society dedicating himself to the poor, homeless, sick, and demobilized servicemen. Blessed Pier Giorgio is known for the phrase "To the Heights", describing both his faith and favourite hobby,

mountain climbing. He spent his last days whispering the names of the people he knew who needed assistance.



First Reading

Malachi 1:14– 2:2. 8-10

I am a great king, says the Lord of hosts, and my name is feared throughout the nations. And now, priests, this warning is for you. If you do not listen, if you do not find it in your heart to glorify my name, says the Lord of hosts, I will send the curse on you and curse your very blessing. You have strayed from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your teaching. You have destroyed the covenant of Levi, says the Lord of hosts. And so I in my turn have made you contemptible and vile in the eyes of the whole people in repayment for the way you have not kept to my paths but have shown partiality in your administration. Have we not all one Father? Did not one God create us? Why, then, do we break faith with one another, profaning the covenant of our ancestors?

Second Reading

1 Thessalonians 2:7-9. 13

Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well. Let me remind you, brothers, how hard we used to work, slaving night and day so as not to be a burden on any one of you while we were proclaiming God's Good News to you. Another reason why we constantly thank God for you is that as soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it.

Gospel

Mt 23: 1-12 Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practice what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi. 'You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'
