Love is something every human person experiences, consciously or not. Yet what is that experience? Today we are reminded that such experiences aren't just coincidental, nor are they fleeting emotive responses to external needs. Rather, these moments and relationships are something far more deeply embedded in our extraordinary nature; an echo of something far more eternal, within us.

In the Gospel, Jesus is asked a question, to which he gives a response that goes deeper than first impressions suggest.

'Which is the first of all the commandments?' That is to say, which commandment undergirds all others? Jesus answers: 'the Lord your God is one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.' It's both fascinating and beautiful to notice that the scribe only ever asks Jesus one question; what the first commandment is, not the second. And yet this is precisely what Jesus goes on to give him. He continues: "...and the second.... well the second is this: you must love your neighbour as yourself."

Jesus highlights the reality that the most obvious of all the commandments, even to many today, namely, love of neighbour, is only possible *by*, and thus lies secondary *to* the first and greatest commandment. Jesus teaches that this is not just the greatest commandment, but the only commandment. For if one honours this first commandment, all others should *naturally* flow forth.

Today, throughout churches, throughout the world, indeed throughout humanity, the first primordial commandment is spoken. The commandment that allows all others to exist. And it summons us to pause... to pause and realise – even if so very briefly – that God doesn't command that we love him because he's power-hungry, egotistical or desperately needy. He demands we love him, not for his benefit... but for ours.

Because the relationships we share, the emotions that drive our passion to love... the feelings which we delight in... do not exist, without, or outside of God! *God is Love* (1 John 4:7) and when love overflows, we get creation, man and woman, parent and child, friends and friendship. We participate in love, the essence and *being* of God.

The very relationships we cherish, admire and long for, are proof not only of God's existence, but of the fact that we truly are living and participating in the life of God. Love of God, and love of neighbour. The two are inseparable, for the first permeates every other reality we know and cherish!

Many today, sadly reduced 'being Christian' to 'loving you neighbour' and that's it! Yet what Jesus echoes this day, is that to *love thy neighbour* (those placed in one's life), is the fruit of God's love dwelling in us; what makes every other relationship possible. God's presence is the very occupation of our existence; for God never loves from a distance!

And so Jesus '...seeing how wisely [the man] had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God', for to experience the sweet bliss that you experience as deep and profound love, is to experience Me, to know I am close, that you may always be led back to me ...

Readings of the Day - 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong

First Reading Dt 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow. 'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Second Reading Heb 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Reading Mk 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord you God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
