

ALL SAINTS DAY & ALL SOULS DAY

Friends.

November calls us to reflect upon the truth of Christ's Body in a particularly beautiful way. On **November 1** we celebrate **All Saints Day**, when we invoked the intercession of those who now gaze upon the face of God (what is often called the 'Church Triumphant'). The magnificence of Saint Christopher's Cathedral is that it expresses this truth each time we enter. Through the charming stain glass windows, we are reminded each day, that we are surrounded by the saints who watch over and intercede for us.

November 2 marks **All Souls Day,** when we pray for the faithful departed and those in purgatory (the 'Church Penitent'). We should always pray for the dead, but in this Month of Holy Souls, we are called to devote particular time and attention each day, that they might remember us before the throne of God when we are most in need of prayers. In this month, let us remember them, in the way the 'Church Triumphant' remembers and assists us. This is the Body, fully alive!

Finally we also call to mind all of us, who remain here, as those who continue on the pilgrim journey (known aptly as the 'Church Militant') When we consider these parts as a whole, we see more clearly the complete Body of Christ; what Saint Augustine called the *totus Christus* (the whole Christ). The feasts we celebrate this week remind us, that we are never separated from those we love. Jesus' Body, draws us together into One, regardless of time or place; and the unifying Sacrament through which this Body is manifest, is the Eucharist.

We pray then *with* and *for* the whole Body of Christ throughout November, especially for all those who have died; family, friends, and those with no one to pray for them. As Christians, we don't travel through the world alone, our salvation is wrapped up with the salvation of others, and charity beckons us to come to their aid, as they will and do to ours.

In this month, we are especially aware of the pain felt by those left behind, especially when it is our children who have gone before us. United in prayer, a twilight Mass for all those who have lost babies and children will be offered on Friday the 18th of November, 6:30pm, in Saint Peter Chanel's Church, Yarralumla. Those who have lost children of any age, are warmly invited to record their child's name on cards available in church foyers (alternatively please let the office know and a card can be made up for you).

On the evening you are invited to light a candle to place before the altar along with the card. In times of grief, let us forever be consoled by Christ, who spoke of the children as the greatest in God's Kingdom.

"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matt 19:14)



First Reading Wis 11:22-12:2

In your sight, Lord, the whole world is like a grain of dust that tips the scales, like a drop of morning dew falling on the ground. Yet you are merciful to all, because you can do all things and overlook men's sins so that they can repent. Yes, you love all that exists, you hold nothing of what you have made in abhorrence, for had you hated anything, you would not have formed it. And how, had you not willed it, could a thing persist, how be conserved if not called forth by you? You spare all things because all things are yours, Lord, lover of life, you whose imperishable spirit is in all. Little by little, therefore, you correct those who offend, you admonish and remind them of how they have sinned, so that they may abstain from evil and trust in you, Lord.

Second Reading 2 Thes 1:11-22

We pray continually that our God will make you worthy of his call, and by his power fulfil all your desires for goodness and complete all that you have been doing through faith; because in this way the name of our Lord Jesus Christ will be glorified in you and you in him, by the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ. To turn now, brothers, to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and how we shall all be gathered round him: please do not get excited too soon or alarmed by any prediction or rumour or any letter claiming to come from us, implying that the Day of the Lord has already arrived.

Gospel Lk 19:1-10

Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'
