

Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish.

During November our beautiful Catholic faith meditates on the Body of Christ in a particular way. On the feast of *All Saints* (Nov 1st), we invoked those faithful who now gaze upon the face of God (*the Church Triumphant*). On *All Souls* day (Nov 2nd) we prayed for the faithful departed and those in purgatory (*the Church Penitent*); and of course we, here, remain the pilgrim faithful journeying on (*the Church Militant*) (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 954-62). This makes us the full Body of Christ, what Saint Augustine called the *totus Christus* (the *whole Christ*). Let us pray throughout November for all those who have died; family, friends, and especially those with no one to pray for them. As Christians, we don't travel through this world alone. Our salvation is wrapped up with the salvation of others, and charity requires us to come to their aid. We must pray for the dead always, but especially in this Month of the Holy Souls, let us devote some time every day, that they might remember us before the throne of God when we are most in need of prayers.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

In October 2020 the Church in Australia will gather for the **Plenary Council**. All are invited to participate in the next phase of preparation, a time of *listening and communal discernment*. This includes those Catholics who have 'fallen away' or perhaps become lukewarm in their faith. On the 19th of November we will gather for the first of six sessions, each focusing on **one of the six themes** identified in the first phase. Join us as we pray, contemplate, share and send our responses, to shape the program for the Council in 2020. Let us not forget the Council's seminal question. 'What do you think God is asking of the Australian Church at this time?' Archbishop Christopher reminds us that "we are to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to us in these challenging times." What "God is asking of us" not what "we are asking of God." This is crucial. We don't seek to, nor can we change the nature of the Church. We can however, change the way we approach our mission. More information to come!

Let us continue to pray for the council, our parish and the Church in Australia, but most especially, let us remain faithful to who She is calling us to be as this great Sacrament of unity.

May we consecrate our Archdiocese and our communities again to the protection of Mary, the first amongst the faithful.

"Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes such a child in My name welcomes Me..." (Matt 18:1, 3-5).

MEMORIAL HYMN SERVICE: The Cathedral Choir will hold a memorial hymn service on **10 November at 6.30pm**. This will be a service of prayers and hymns requested by parishioners in memory of their deceased loved ones. The hymns 'in memoriam' will be sung by the choir and congregation together. First Reading

Wis 11:22-12:2

In your sight, Lord, the whole world is like a grain of dust that tips the scales, like a drop of morning dew falling on the ground. Yet you are merciful to all, because you can do all things and overlook men's sins so that they can repent. Yes, you love all that exists, you hold nothing of what you have made in abhorrence, for had you hated anything, you would not have formed it. And how, had you not willed it, could a thing persist, how be conserved if not called forth by you? You spare all things because all things are yours, Lord, lover of life, you whose imperishable spirit is in all. Little by little, therefore, you correct those who offend, you admonish and remind them of how they have sinned, so that they may abstain from evil and trust in you, Lord.

Second Reading

2 Thes 1:11-2:2

We pray continually that our God will make you worthy of his call, and by his power fulfil all your desires for goodness and complete all that you have been doing through faith; because in this way the name of our Lord Jesus Christ will be glorified in you and you in him, by the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

To turn now, brothers, to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and how we shall all be gathered round him: please do not get excited too soon or alarmed by any prediction or rumour or any letter claiming to come from us, implying that the Day of the Lord has already arrived.

Gospel Reading

Luke 19:1-10

Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'
