This week's Gospel is challenging. The gifts many placed into the synagogue treasury were merely 'token'. That is to say, the 'offerings' made, demanded nor real significant thing of the individuals making them... no *real* effort, no *real* commitment, or loss, and sadly no *real* amount faith!

When in truth faith always costs something, or at least it should. Not strictly financial – which is symbolic of a greater act – but something of the heart and most certainly of the ego!

Either Jesus is the Son of God, who becomes incarnate, breathes life into our souls, dies for our sins and nourishes us in the sacraments of our Catholic faith, as our destination and purpose... or he is not. Jesus either is who he said he is, or... he lies.

Whatever our conclusion, our faith, and Jesus himself causes us to make a serious decision. One cannot simply remain 'lukewarm' to the words Jesus speaks.

If Jesus is who we profess him to be, then our whole life must be consumed by and lived in imitation of Him, as best it can. We must strive to live our lives, not just those who will have to give account of our lives at the end of time, but as those who know and (without fear) live as sons and daughters, destined Eternal Life and the glory of the Resurrection!

This is what is described in Mark's Gospel. Jesus 'sitting opposite the treasury and watching people putting money in', uses this moment, as he always does, as an opportunity to teach. '....this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'

She gives her whole self, not just part, nor just what's convenient (it certain wasn't that), or neat. This woman holds nothing back... and so to the true Christian. Jesus, our God, isn't merely the 'surplus' or a part of our lives – he must be our *whole* life.

In this way, while weekly contributions are a very important part of our faith, a concrete way of actualising this 'giving of oneself', as well as a monetary way of supporting our parish community – the Gospel is not about money at all, but rather the human heart.

It's not the amount we give, but the fullness of what we give. Is Christ just an 'addition' to our lives? Or is he, quite rightly, the *centre* of it. Logic itself dictates, we must make a decision.

Archbishop Christopher in a 2018 homily on this passage, observed:

"There is an important lesson to be learnt here... best summarised in the beautiful quote from the fourth century famous theologian St Ambrose of Milan...."God does not consider what one gives but what one keeps." Jesus is making the observation that the religious lawyers and theologians are only giving their wealth whilst engaging in injustice, while the poor widow puts in everything and keeps nothing for herself.

In so doing this poor widow, foreshadows what Jesus demonstrates on the Calvary Cross. Jesus also did not keep anything for himself. Even the last drop of blood and water coming from His side indicated that He gave absolutely everything of His physical body as a symbol of His self-emptying to the Father for our salvation."

In the gift of the Mass, knowing that God gives to us, so generously, his whole self in the Eucharist, let us return in a complete act of self-giving. For Jesus is "[giving] us the loving warning that he is not simply looking at what we give but what we keep."

Friends, let us place Jesus once more at the centre of all we do and all we are. Faith should claim something of us; of our will, our desires, and most especially and beautifully, of our restless heart.

Readings of the Day - 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

Responsorial Psalm: Praise the Lord, my soul!

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives

me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

First Reading 1 Kgs 17:10-16

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said, 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives', she replied, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel: "Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth." The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Second Reading Heb 9:24-28

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

Gospel Reading Mk 12:38-44

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.'

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'
