A Warm Welcome to St Christopher's Cathedral Parish, especially to any visitors.

Today's parable in the Gospel can be puzzling, and yet at the same time strikingly clear. Perhaps it is simply easiest to turn to the last lines where Jesus exhorts – "keep awake therefore, for you do not know the day nor the hour".

Our readiness and openness to the Grace of Christ and the Holy Spirit must be front and centre of and in our *daily* life. It is not something of 'the future', but here and now. This much seems clear. If anything, the pandemic that has seized our world, has taught us how unpredictable and quickly life can change; and yet amongst all of this change, there is the One who remains Constant among us, here and now.

We might still ask though, what is the deeper meaning within the parable? It seems clear that Jesus is the Bridegroom returning, but what of the 10 virgins, and the oil lamps they carry?

Oil has long been a symbol of the Spirit. While Jesus' parables would have easily appealed to the culture and understandings of the day, today Jesus might use the image of a runner or a professional athlete to communicate the same message. Why? Well, each of these people *prepares* for the big moment they are heading towards; and they do so by preparing each and every day, even in the smallest of ways A marathon runner does not simply wake up and decide to run a marathon the day of. Rather, they prepare, they nourish and develop the habits, devotions and perseverance long before the big moment is upon them. In a word, they are (well and truly) ready.

One might think of the oil lamps in the same light (no pun intended). We are daily graced with the Holy Spirit, in the Sacraments and the Word, through which He flows forth into us as daughters and sons. Do we consciously receive this grace daily, welcoming, and ready for God's Word to change us?

As our hearts are stretched, our capacity to receive the grace of His Spirit, grows deeper. St Paul even warns in a letter to the Thessalonians, 'pray without ceasing... [and] do not quench the

Spirit' (1 Thess 5:17.19). Do we welcome the Grace Christ which is so generous in lavish upon us? When we contemplate Jesus' words in this way, we realise why it is that the wise could not share their oil. Because while one can witness Christ to the other through their life, they cannot 'share' or lend their own relationship with Christ, no matter how much either desires it. Rather, one needs to have and nurture their own. The foolish virgins, having little or no oil of the Spirit, even retreating in the last moment in order to 'get some'. And note, when they do return, there is no mention if they collected oil or not; they simply 'want in' to the banquet. This is a hard teaching, but a beautiful one. They have not prepared themselves for a relationship with the Bridegroom any more than the spectator has prepared themselves for the Origin match or the AFL final. The Day has arrived, and they are unprepared to meet it, with no oil in their lamp. No other person is able to do it for them, but one must do it for themselves.

Pope Francis, in a Sunday Angelus reflecting on this very parable in 2017 asked:

"What does Jesus wish to teach us with this parable? It is a matter of not waiting until the last minute of our lives to cooperate with the grace of God, but rather to do so as of now. It would be good to consider for a moment: one day will be the last. If it were today, how prepared am I? But I must do this and that.... Be ready as if it were the last day: this does us good. (*Angelus*, 12 Nov 2017)

This is the true *Wisdom* spoken of and permeating this week's readings. Let us pray then, for true wisdom, wisdom given from above, that our lamps may always be 'lit', our hearts ready for his glorious coming.

Readings of the Day – 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord. **RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God. **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:** Alleluia, alleluia! Be watchful and ready: you know not when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluial

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

First Reading

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim. By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates. Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you. She herself walks about looking for those who are worthy of her and graciously shows herself to them as they go, in every thought of theirs coming to meet them.

Second Reading

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

Gospel Reading

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'
