SOLOMON, IF ONLY YOU LISTENED TO YOUR MOTHER!

I would like to focus on our first reading, we should look at it in some depth. This is a really popular choice for weddings and funerals. It speaks to what is truly great and good in women; we are shown the image of a hard working wife. She toils and labours for her family, she is trusted and trustworthy, her husband never fears what she might be up to.

This passage is seen by some as controversial. Sadly, anything in our society that mentions women has become controversial. Context really helps us here. The chapter of the Book of Proverbs (31) which our reading is taken from, is titled *The Sayings of Lemuel king of Maasa, taught him by his mother*.

This passage is not a man telling a woman how to act or how to behave, but rather a mother telling her son what sort of a woman he should marry. This isn't a male ideal of a woman, but a female ideal of a daughter-in-law. This is also the Word of God.

There are several omissions which might raise an eyebrow: sex is never mentioned here, neither is purity or virginity. Children and fertility are also absent in this description of a perfect wife. Beauty, charm and elegance, are seen as trivial things which quickly pass away.

The point which the author's mother stresses is that virtue, the character of a woman, is what is truly of value. This perfect wife is a hard worker, she takes initiative, she is never idle or wasteful but also concerned with doing good. She brings help, not harm to her husband and is seen to be a good and responsible citizen, and active and loved member of the community. The Bible tells us that she deserves her wages and her well-earned respect.

I see in this passage an echo of the garden of Eden, Adam looked through all the animals and gave them their names, but couldn't find a worthy helper. When Adam first lays eyes on Eve, he doesn't say "what a babe!", he says "Here at last is flesh of my flesh, and bone of my bone." We see again the Godly ideal: Man and Woman united in love, respect and working together for the good of all.

There is another point to raise, who is King Lemuel of Maasa? He's a figure not mentioned again in the Bible. There seem to be two schools of thought, one that he is a king from a tribe in Northern Arabia, another that he is really a pseudonym for King Solomon.

If this second school is right, it means then that the true author of this proverb was Bathsheba (coerced to become David's wife, mother of Solomon and an ancestor of Jesus). Bathsheba is often portrayed as either a victim of a man's lust or a seductress, if these are her own words then we see her as a woman calling out for her son to see women not as objects but as persons.

Sadly, Solomon didn't listen to his mother and his lust for women drove him far from God. His divided heart would cause his kingdom to fall, and the people of God to suffer for centuries. Let us make sure that we don't fall into the same trap, a person's worth is found not in their body but in their soul.





First Reading

Proverbs 31:10-13. 19-20. 30-31

A perfect wife- who can find her? She is far beyond the price of pearls. Her husband's heart has confidence in her, from her he will derive no little profit. Advantage and not hurt she brings him all the days of her life. She is always busy with wool and with flax, she does her work with eager hands. She sets her hands to the distaff, her fingers grasp the spindle. She holds out her hand to the poor, she opens her arms to the needy. Charm is deceitful, and beauty is empty; the woman who is wise is the one to praise. Give her a share in what her hands have worked for, and let her works hell her praises at the city gates.

Second Reading

1 Thessalonians 5: 1-6

You will not be expecting us to write anything to you, brothers, about 'times and seasons', since you know very well that the Day of the Lord is going to come life a thief in the night. It is when people are saying, 'How quiet and peaceful it is' that the worst suddenly happens, as suddenly as labour pains come on a pregnant woman; and there will be no way for anybody to evade it. But it is not as if you live in the dark, my brothers, for that Day to overtake you like a thief. No, you are all sons of light and sons of the day: we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake and sober.

Gospel

Mt 25: 14-30

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each is proportion to his ability. Then he set out. The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will entrust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir,' said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and went off and hid you talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
