### CHRIST THE UNCHANGING KING

What does this mean for us? Christ should reign in us, not our own will but His. I have been asked to take care of Temora parish for a few months whilst their priest is away, so this will be farewell for a while. I admit I have mixed emotions, I am excited to care for a parish on my own, but I am sad to be away from you for a few months. Please continue to pray for me whilst I am away.

It is a reminder to me of how much of our world changes and how quickly. The priests we have might change over, the parishes we are assigned to change and move, the house I live in, the car I drive, all of these things change.

There is one person that never changes. Our faith never changes - even though our priests might, the food we eat, the work we do, the city we live in all change - but God is always in charge, and nothing can remove God from His authority.

This is the purpose of the feast of Christ the King. Ninety-nine years ago, Pope Pius XI established this feast. He saw that in the wake of the First World War the world was changing quicker than ever before, new technologies and new ideologies swept through people's minds. Pope Pius XI was concerned that in the midst of such change and new distractions, and fearful of new and growing persecutions of the Church, the faithful might forget the ancient and singular truth – Christ is King.

All power and all authority is given to him, and thus everything we endure or experience has a part of his plan. This should be for us a source of great courage and strength. There is no suffering in which He is not compassionate, there is no plea or cry that goes unheard, there is nothing that is out of his reach or his rule.

What type of a king is Christ: "And the King will answer, I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch

over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them." and, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

One day Christ will return to us, and He will judge the world. On this feast of Christ the King, let us pledge ourselves to Him again, let his rule reign in our hearts, let the love of this temporary world fade and the love of eternity bloom.

### **First Reading**

### Ezekiel 34:11-12. 15-17

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.

### Second Reading

### 1 Corinthians 15:20-26. 28

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

### Gospel

### Mt 25: 31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you never sited to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
