THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT – GAUDETE SUNDAY

As we fast approach Christmas, the greatest moment of joy not only for the Christian, but for 'all people of good will', the world looks more than usual a mess. And it is not just the world. Perhaps our own lives too seem muddled in some way?

Yet, we must never forget that it was into the midst of this mess, that God chose to be born. The mess is not foreign to him, nor does he avoid it.

With this, our question becomes identical to the one put to John the Baptist in the Gospel: *'What must we do?'* (Lk 3:10) What must we do, faced with the mess? Because despite what many think and say, there is much we can do. We are not powerless.

The prophet Zephaniah and the Gospel today echo the joyful proclamation that the longedfor Saviour, the victorious warrior is in our midst, so 'shout for joy' they exhort! Our Psalm too proclaims "Cry out with Joy and Gladness". And Saint Paul only adds to the chorus, "rejoice always!"

But the question... the *real* question – and we must always deal with facts – remains for many: what reason, with everything besieging me, do I have to rejoice? In times such as ours, can we really rejoice? And what does Joy look like?

On this 3rd Sunday of Advent, we celebrate *Gaudete Sunday*, which translates from the Latin, *Rejoice*. Half way through our Advent preparation we are reminded that this is our identity.

It is intriguing to contemplate happiness and joy. Many say, I just 'want to be happy'. After all, we're made for just that! Some even make it their life goal. Yet this could be seen as problematic at best. Why? Because unlike joy, happiness (the way we often think of it) is almost always circumstantial.

Joy on the other hand I once heard described as the *pervasive sense of well-being*. And so joy is something which can remain, regardless of circumstances. Joy, unlike happiness, gives an identity and promise. With so much going on in our lives – good and bad – the Christian can still possess joy!

Many fall prey to the thought that when I'm 'done' with all this, I'll finally be happy. But we all know... that when we do finally achieve that 'thing', that task, that goal... we're still not 'happy'. So... we simply move the goal posts. 'that didn't make me happy. Maybe this next thing will?!' To live like this however, is like basing our lives on the flip of a coin, or on the roll of a die.

If we want happiness in a way that's not contingent and passing, in a way that can't be taken away – it can't be based on mere chance; reliant on external (and even internal) situations.

Joy, as the abiding and pervasive sense of well-being, is founded on a far deeper, unmovable level. *Jesus*. GK Chesterton once wrote: "Joy, is the great secret of the Christian." Before Jesus came, one either believed in chance and fate or relied on happiness merely emerging from circumstances and their own making.

Yet now we have happiness incarnate. When God comes to us, we receive certainty of who we are and to whom we belong, a certainty which can never be taken away; and so too a promise, not dependent on our success or failures, our luck, income or even talents.

If we have Eyes to See this truth, we are able to see the magnificence at the heart of the mess... Christian joy comes from knowing that *God is with us*. And how Magnificent it is! We do not always see Him with our eyes but we *do* see that wherever Jesus is, people change. There is a greater capacity for peace, HOPE, and love. And that is most certainly a reason to rejoice!



Readings of the Day – 3rd week of Advent —Year C



First Reading

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

Second Reading

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Reading

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
