Happy Australia Day to all parishioners and visitors.

What a glorious and beautiful country we live in, with so much to give thanks for, and yet in these days it is the destruction and havoc of fires and drought, which occupies our minds and hearts.

On January 20, Archbishop Christopher recalled: "...we are in the midst of a most dangerous bushfire season. Already too many lives have been lost. The destruction... is widespread. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the families and communities impacted during this time of bushfires, [and] we continue our prayers for more rain in our drought-stricken land... Our Catholic Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn has been severely impacted both with the drought and now the bushfires; ...the smoke haze is virtually a daily health concern for so many." The Archbishop then observed however, the great compassion and love shown in these days by so many. "Typically [though], the practical generosity of the Archdiocese has been immediate. The financial twinning of city parishes with fire effected parishes and the generosity of so many others is a wonderful example of practical charity. Extra co-ordination of our educational, health and social services is evident to ensure those most in need are receiving help and our prayerful support."

I can't help but ask, is this not what we celebrate on this Australia day? This love we bear for each other, is that not what really makes Australia the wonderful country it is?

In the past week the Archbishop has made pastoral visits to our South Coast parishes, and those affected in and around Tumut, assuring all of our prayerful and practical support.

The season of bushfire and drought is far from over; and so our support will continue. To this end, the Australian Catholics Bishops Conference has implemented a national response. Conference President, Archbishop Coleridge writes: "Expressions of solidarity are important, but... not enough... this crisis requires a national response from the whole Church." A national collection will therefore be taken up in all parishes across Australia on this Australia Day weekend; all funds being donated to the Vinnies' bushfire appeal.

Our own Archdiocese in the immediate days and weeks responded to such a need without haste, and so while a formal collection won't be taken this weekend, if you would like to donate, there will be an opportunity after each Mass, as in weeks past.

The Australian Bishops have also implemented a nation response which includes:

- •The facilitation of a national network connecting people affected by the bushfires with people who can help with preparing meals, clearing properties, rebuilding communities, as well as pastoral and counselling support.
- •The distribution of prayers and resources for use in parishes, families and Catholic communi-
- Collaboration with key national agencies like Catholic Health Australia, Catholic Social Services Australia, and the St Vincent de Paul Society to ensure as effective a response as possible from the wider Catholic community.
- •Cooperating with Catholic Religious Australia and religious institutes and their ministries. (the full statement is available at the back of the church and online).

May God who formed our southern land be for us a rock of strength. May God who rules our southern seas keep us safe in every storm. May God who made our southern skies turn our darkness into light. And May God bless us and our Country, this Great South Land of the Holy Spirit, this day and always. Our Lady Help of Christians and Patroness of Australia: Pray for us Happy Australia Day!

First Reading Is 8:23 – 9:3

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase, they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

Second Reading 1 Cor 1:10-13, 17

I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

Gospel Reading Mt 4:12-23

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned. From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him. Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.
