Farewell Monsignor Kevin Barry-Cotter

Last week (the 26th February) we received the sad news of Monsignor Kevin Barry-Cotter's death. Father Kevin was a man of great humility, gentleness and patience. A wise and compassionate priest with a profound intellect, playful wit and deep faith, Fr Kevin will be deeply missed.

Some of the first words of Jesus to Peter were, "follow me". They were also the last words Jesus spoke to Peter when he called him watch over his flock. These moments are echoed in the life of Father Kevin, a towering figure of fatherly tenderness and fidelity to so many of our Archdio-



cese and beyond, over so many years. Father Kevin knew the one he followed and cherished the way he was led by him. Fr Kevin in his young years heard the call of Jesus, just as the first disciples before him, and he answered 'ves' daily, over 60 years of priesthood.

Born on the 14th of June 1934, in Leichardt, Father Kevin was the eldest of five children. He attended primary school at St. Columba's, North Leichardt and later Christian Brothers High School in Lewisham. His studies for the priesthood would begin in 1954 at St. Columba's College, Springwood, until the move to St. Patrick's Manly in February of 1957. Later in October of that same year the adventure continued, and Kevin boarded the boat destined for Rome. At the Pontifical Urban College, he would study, and later be ordained a priest in the Basilica of Saint Peter.

When the young Fr Kevin return to Australia, he was appointed to our own St. Peter Chanel's in Yarralumla in the December of 1964. The following year would see him appointed to St. Christopher's Cathedral and the Archdiocesan Tribunal. In 1966 he would become the Acting Diocesan Secretary and two years later Vice Chancellor and Chancellor in 1971.

Fr Kevin served in St. Benedict's Narrabundah (1969); St. Christopher's Cathedral (1971); St. Patrick's Michelago (PP) (1974); St. Patrick's Cooma (PP) (1979); Sacred Heart West Queanbeyan (while Vicar for Education and Synod Co-ordinator, 1988); St. Mary's West Wyalong (PP) (1995); and in 2005 Sacred Heart Cootamundra (PP). In 2014 Fr Kevin retired to his beloved Adelong.

Father Kevin will be greatly missed by many, no more than his family and brother priests. What a beautiful witness and legacy he has left us. He was truly a priest after the heart of Christ. We commend Fr Kevin to the grace and mercy of the God whom he served so faithfully and generously.

Fr Kevin, may you rest now in the peace of Christ, and may you rise in Glory on the last day. We thank God for your life, and for your priesthood. And we thank *you* for bringing us the presence and friendship of our God.

It is now *our* turn to bid you farewell - one last time - with those same words you would farewell us with, at the end of each conversation: "Go gentle, my friend."

Readings of the Day - 3rd Sunday of Lent —Year B



ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

First Reading Ex 20:1-17

God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. 'You shall have no gods except me. 'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments. 'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it. 'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. You shall do no work on that day, neither you nor your son nor your daughter nor your servants, men or women, not your animals nor the stranger who lives with you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold, but on the seventh day he rested; that is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it sacred. 'Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to you. 'You shall not kill. 'You shall not commit adultery. 'You shall not steal. 'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. 'You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.'

Second Reading 1 Cor 1:22-25

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Gospel Reading Jn 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.
