

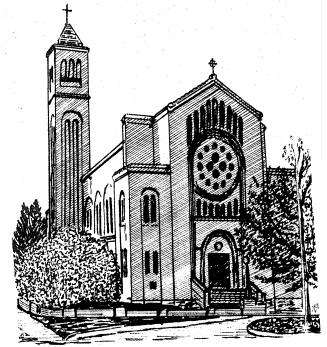

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near"
(Philippians 4:4).

Dear parishioners and visitors,

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete Sunday*, from the Latin, "rejoice", taken from the entrance antiphon from Philippians. *Gaudete Sunday* comes halfway through our advent journey and reminds us of the true joy which permeates this season; a joy that could risk becoming somewhat hidden after the year we have had. The Incarnation, we are heartened, is our greatest (nay, our only) reason to truly Rejoice!

This truth for Saint Paul resounded in the heart the 20th Century theologian and priest, Hans Urs von Balthasar in a particularly soberingly, inspiring and human way- as reflected in one of his own advent homilies.

On that holy night, the shepherds are visited by the angel, who radiates the "blinding glory of God... though they are very much afraid" And how can they not tremble, overcome with such a tremendous, unearthly radiance? But after the Glory of God is announced, the angels depart and silence takes its place.

Challengingly, yet sensitively von Balthasar observes how, having heard the angels' words, "...they set off, heaven behind them, and the earthly sign before them."

"But, Lord, what a sign! ...a child... [and] not a child radiating a light of glory, as the religious painters depicted, but on the contrary: a child that looks as inglorious as possible. Wrapped in swaddling clothes. So that it cannot move. It lies there, imprisoned, as it were, in the clothes in which it has been wrapped through the solicitude of others."

He continues: "There is nothing elevating about the manger in which he lies either, nothing even remotely corresponding to the heavenly glory of the singing angels. There is practically nothing even half worth seeing; the destination of the shepherds' nightly journey is the most ordinary scene. Indeed, its poverty is decidedly disappointing. It is something entirely human and ordinary, something quite profane, in no way distinguished—except for the fact that this is the promised sign, and it fits."

No wonder so many miss the sign, he concludes. The 'glory' now vanished, one must have eyes to see - for now left behind was only the true 'human glow of Joy, Jesus, [and] in the shepherds souls, a light of joyous expectation, reinforcing the heavenward-pointing angel's word..."

The heavenly epiphany, we are powerfully reminded again in 2020, was *merely a starting point*, "an initial spark, a stimulus leading to what was really intended". The Word made flesh, and now in the darkness, *our* darkness, living among us! Now begins "the tiny seed of the word" says von Balthasar, "that has been implanted in [our] hearts and that now starts to grow in the form of expectation, curiosity and hope". God is among His people, not by mere symbol or ephemeral word, but by *the* Word Incarnate; and He will come again!

The shepherds see the Word that has "happened", the Word that has taken place, the Word that is no more a mere announcement, but dwelling among us!

Dear friends, this is our hope - let us *rejoice* this day in the promise which has 'happened', the promise Who is ours.

Entry to the Cathedral disruptions and parking: Scaffolding around the bell tower will remain for some weeks to come. The large ramp at the front/side of the Cathedral is temporarily removed due to weddings and will be reinstalled mid Dec. This is required due to significant roof foundation repairs to the bell tower roof. Pedestrian access and disabled parking has also been moved during this time. PRESENT PROTOCOLS - Please be familiar with current guidelines

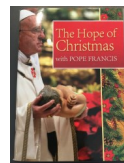
- In accordance with government restrictions, only 260 people are permitted in the Cathedral at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are securely stored and destroyed after 28 days.
- All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- Communion is received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 2sqm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. *NB:* Families can sit together.
- Please use hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided.
- There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates are in use, but money/envelopes can be deposited at collection points.
- Please DO NOT return your bulletin to the basket, but keep or dispose of appropriately. **Please maintain social distancing 1.5m, at all times, including in the single line formed to receive Holy Communion.** Blue squares and yellow markers on the tiles indicate these distances. Thank you for your commitment in keeping everyone safe.

First Reading

Is 61:1-2. 10-11

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. 'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

Second Reading

1 Thes 5:16-24

Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God, because this is what God expects you to do in Christ Jesus. Never try to suppress the Spirit or treat the gift of prophecy with contempt; think before you do anything – hold on to what is good and avoid every form of evil. May the God of peace make you perfect and holy; and may you all be kept safe and blameless, spirit, soul and body, for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. God has called you and he will not fail you.

Gospel Reading

Jn 1:6-8. 19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.' Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
