## **3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

On Tuesday we celebrate the Conversion of Saint Paul. Saul, who later received the name Paul, was a relentless persecutor of Christians. At the moment of his conversion we hear the voice of the Lord ask: "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" (Acts 9:4). This is a turning point in how we understand Christ's Body and so ours, the Church.

Saul asks "Who are you, Lord?" only to receive the reply, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." (v.5). Notice, Jesus does not ask, "why are you persecuting my followers in Damascus?", or "Those who speak my Name", but 'why are you persecuting *me*?' In Matthew's gospel he'll teach, 'just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me' (Mt 25:40). Jesus' Body is our body, and ours, his. This is no mere symbol, but a living, tangible truth.

Today Jesus is found in the synagogue, "as was his custom" on the Sabbath, reading from prophet Isaiah. At this early moment of his ministry, Jesus announces his mission in continuity with Israel's prophetic tradition. This passage from Isaiah defines his ministry – it is a place of a *new beginning*. Jesus, is the fulfilment of the ancient promise. "Today…. fulfilled in your hearing."

Jesus proclaims: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...". Only weeks ago we heard the Spirit hovered over Jesus in the Jordan. But the Spirit is upon him to do something! To preach Good News to the poor, sight to the blind, and release to captives – a captivity and blindness which are more than physical!

In short, Jesus is inaugurating the 'acceptable year of the Lord', a significant phrase to the Jewish people. Every 50 years they would celebrate a kind of jubilee which promised the release of slaves, forgiveness of debts, and a return of lands. This tradition became the framework for God's promise of salvation. Indeed, in Jesus something entirely *new* begins. For he not only announces God's salvation, but brings it about in his very Person. True release, true forgiveness and the true promise of a lasting homeland.

It is the anointing which Jesus received which brought about such release. When Jesus does this he is teaching us too: 'following the path I tread, as living members of my body, follow in my footsteps. Follow as I have followed; *not my will but the Father's be done* (Mk 14:36).

As members of Christ's *living* body, we are not passive travellers, but called and anointed to play our role in the body, instruments of that same power and mission to reconcile and forgive. To loosen the bonds of others, as members of God's Body. Christ working in and though his people.

This means forgiving those who has hurt us. One of the hardest things to do, and impossible with human strength alone. We are to sanctify the world though our daily work. Protect the dignity of human life and creation with our voices. And actively become living witnesses of the Hope Jesus alone gives in the darkness. This is what we are 'anointed' to do. And when we do, we build up the body of Christ.

This is the *One ministry of Jesus*, alive in his Body the Church, 'today, being fulfilled in our hearing'— the great jubilee!

### 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C — 22/23 January



**Entrance Antiphon:** O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.

Responsorial Psalm: Your words, Lord, are spirit and life.

**Gospel Acclamation:** The Lord sent me to bring Good News to the poor and freedom to prisoners.

**Communion Antiphon:** I am the light of the world, says the Lord; whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.

First Reading Neh 8:2-6, 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people – since he stood higher than all the people – Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen!; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read. Then Nehemiah – His Excellency – and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law. He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'

#### **Second Reading**

### 1 Cor 12:12-30 (Shorter Version 12:12-14,27)

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink. Nor is the body to be identified with any one of its many parts. Now you together are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it.

Gospel Lk 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received. Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him. He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written: The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour. He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'
