In the Gospel for the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the people in the synagogue react to Jesus, whose teaching leaves a 'deep impression' upon them. Jesus was unlike anyone they had ever heard speak in the synagogue before. He taught with an authority they had not seen in the scribes whom they were so familiar with (Mk 1:22). What was it about this man that caused such a reaction?

Nobody has ever taught like Jesus. Not only did he speak with authority – in that he could cast out evil, as we see in today's gospel – but he spoke with an authority which was reliant upon no one else but Himself. This perhaps was the most perplexing and indeed aggravating thing to the Jewish leaders of the day.

When the rabbis taught in the synagogue, they would often quote one expert, opinion and tradition after another, gradually, and logically, making links, all the way back to Moses. But now, Jesus spoke with the authority of God Himself. Jesus spoke not of the Word, but as the Word. Indeed, even the unclean spirit itself cries out: "I know who you are: the Holy One of God" (Mk 1:24).

Jesus teaches with an astonishing authority over spirits, over nature, and over all other things – for He is the Lord of all, the Word of God now in our midst!

Let us then, as St Paul exhorts in the second reading, give undivided attention and devotion to the Lord, most especially when he speaks. Let us have the Word of God at the centre of our lives – of all we are, of all we do.

Saint Jerome once observed "When we approach the [Eucharistic] Mystery, if a crumb falls to the ground we are troubled. Yet when we are listening to the word of God, and God's Word and Christ's flesh and blood are being poured into our ears yet we pay no heed, what great peril should we not feel? (Jerome's *Commentary on the Psalms* [In Psalmum 147: CCL 78, 337–338]).

So friends, let us forever remain attentive to the God who does not remain silent, but speaks to us each day through His Beloved Son – Whoever has ears, let them hear (Matt 11:15).



First Reading

Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 7:32-35

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks. but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Gospel

Mark 1:21-28 Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be guiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
