

THE POWER OF A NAME

In our readings, we can see a theme: names and what people are called. In our first reading, the prophet Isaiah is trying to convince the wicked King Ahaz not to lose faith in the sight of a foreign invasion into Judah. Ahaz is a wicked king who offered his own sons in sacrifice to pagan gods (2 Chronicles 28:3) and has not kept true to the example of David. Ahaz refuses to ask God for a sign, and God prescribes one instead. A maiden will conceive and her son will be called Emmanuel, a name which means God with us. In something of an ironic twist, this son will also be offered as a sacrifice for the salvation of the people of Israel.

In our Gospel, we see this prophecy fulfilled; Jesus is born of the Virgin Mary, and called most appropriately God with us. Saint Joseph then gives Our Lord the name Jesus. I am quick to recognize this might seem as though Joseph has missed the memo, Emmanuel is not necessarily a personal name, it is what people will call Jesus, and the meaning of the name Emmanuel is fulfilled in the incarnation in the person of Jesus who is truly God with us.

What then does the name Jesus mean? It is not a family name for either Mary or Joseph. It is another name chosen for its meaning. The name Jesus means 'Yahweh is salvation.' A very fitting name for the newborn messiah.

Jesus is the same name as Joshua. Joshua was the man who succeeded and fulfilled the instructions of Moses and led Israel out of her wandering and into the Promised Land. Once again, we see what was prefigured in the Old Testament fulfilled in the person of Jesus.

The name of Jesus not only describes his role, but it introduces himself. There is nothing more personal to someone than his or her name. Now that we know the name of God we can call upon him, we can know him personally. This was not always the case, the name of Jesus was held so sacred that it was protected in secrecy; the Jewish people to this day still do not use the name of God. How blessed are we that God has shared his name with us. Knowing the name of Jesus is a privilege we do not deserve. God is under no obligation to do so, he has no need of introducing himself to us, and he isn't accountable to us. God is so gracious he allows us to call him upon him; God is so good he wants us to know him.

By sharing his name with us, God is sharing himself.

Let us take him up on his invitation.



4th Sunday of Advent Year A — 17/18 December



Entrance Antiphon: Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth

be opened and bring forth a Saviour. **Responsorial:** Let the Lord enter; he is King of glory

Gospel Acclamation: A virgin will give birth to a son; his name will be Emmanuel: God is with us.

Communion Antiphon: Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights, and behold the joy which comes to you from God.

First Reading Is 7:10-14

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No', Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.' Then Isaiah said: 'Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men without trying the patience of my God, too? The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means "God-is-with-us".

Second Reading Rom 1:1-7

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures. This news is about the Son of God, who, according to the human nature he took, was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Gospel Mt 1:18-24

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
