ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.

THE CREED – THE CHARTER OF OUR FAITH – PART III

As we continue our discussion of the Creed we need to ask a further question – what is it that the Creed does?

The Creed does five things.

First, it narrates the Christian myth. In saying this we have to be very clear that a myth is not a statement about something that is false. On the contrary, to say something is a myth, is to use language that seeks to express a truth about the world and humans that lies beyond what we can test and prove. So, the story enshrined in the Creed is a myth. It tells how God has entered the human story. It tells us how God has enabled humans to enter God's own community of life and love (that is, the Trinity). This myth answers the three questions asked by every religion and philosophy of life: where do we come from? We come from God, and are created by God. Who are we? We are God's children through Jesus His Son. Where are we going? We hope to share in eternal life with God.

Second, the Creed interprets Sacred Scripture. Our statement of faith provides a summary that guides and directs the proper reading of Scripture. The Creed unobtrusively supplies us with the code for understanding the written Word of God.

Third, the Creed constructs a world. By praying the Creed we affirm that the world as imagined by Sacred Scripture and constructed by the Creed is the world in which we choose to live.

Fourth, the Creed guides Christian practice. The Creed establishes the right belief (what we call orthodoxy) that lets us recognize right practice (what is also known as orthopraxy). Thus, the Creed provides a bridge between the witness of Sacred Scripture and the moral lives of believers.

Finally, the Creed prepares us as a community in the midst of worship. The Creed moves us, in the midst of the liturgy, from the Liturgy of the Word, to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Hence, the Creed helps create, each week at Eucharist, an actively committed people, prepared to enter into the mystery that shapes and nourishes our common life.

First Reading

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

Second Reading

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

Gospel Reading

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
