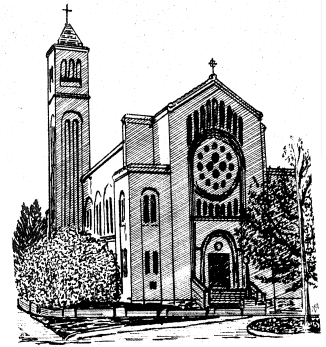

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers; those with us, those who have died, and mothers to be. The Christian truth that *God never loves from a distance*, finds its echo in motherhood. Here we see a living image of the God who promises and gives life; who weaves his very presence into the fabric of human existence.

Today, we give thanks for the sacrifice and love we have known from our mothers; and too our wives, sisters, friends, religious and all women who echo the tenderness, wisdom, presence, and beauty of the God who becomes flesh and walks this journey with us.

'What is the greatest revelation from God you have ever witnessed?' a gentleman asked me before my ordination. The miracle of the Incarnation? The gift of the Eucharist? I paused, the word 'revelation' circling my mind... I could only utter... 'motherhood'.

As a boy and young man I recall thinking, if a woman, a mother, a wife, a friend, a sister can love that much, be that comforting, that beautiful, that wise, how much more must God be all of these? and more! Indeed, the witness of genuine femininity in so many women, is what confirmed my own call. Motherhood and true femininity – God has made the school of love for the human heart.

Perhaps it is no coincidence that today we celebrate *Good Shepherd Sunday*, when we pray for an increase of young men to answer the call of the Good Shepherd to serve as priests. For it is from the tenderness of women that so many first experience this alluring love and touch, and so the great call to serve and love in Christ's priesthood.

On mother's day we recall the mystery of a God who *chose* to place Himself, tiny and helplessly dependent, into the protective womb and loving arms of a human mother. From Mary, God takes flesh. Is there any greater vocation? Is there any other path which is so intimate a witness and participation in God's creative, nurturing love?

Where would I be, where would any of us be, without the gift of motherhood; without the incredibly powerful and alluring witness of genuine femininity?

How sad to see a culture blind itself to the greatest of all vocations, when it attempts to discourage and belittle, and even redefine what a motherhood is and so what it is 'worth'. How shameful. Modern societal trends seem obsessed with removing the feminine and so disregarding and condemning as weakness and archaic all that motherhood is. Surely *this* is the greatest of all thefts we face!

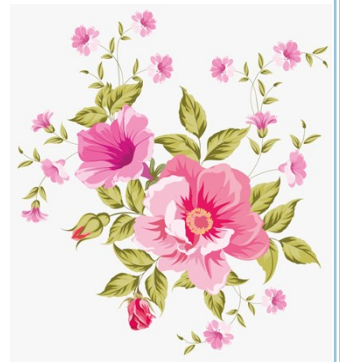
We pray that all people will honour the dignity and vocation of motherhood, recognising it as the foundation it is - the *first* vocation and the greatest gift of God's love the world could ever know.

We pray for all mothers, including those with lives marred by struggle, disappointment, and violence. May they be relieved of these burdens, know their dignity, and the closeness of their God. For mothers who have lost children, may you find consolation in God's promise of life, the support of those around you, and the promise of being united with your child once again. We pray too for mothers to be and of course for all those who experience the agonising pain of infertility and difficulty conceiving.

May is dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God, and our Mother. Mary was chosen above all women; her faith and obedience to God's free invitation and grace, granted the way to the Incarnation and our life with God. Mary's example teaches us faith, humility and how to truly respond to love, by responding to the call of Love Himself. It's fitting that we begin May with today's celebration, the vocation beyond compare. For a mother is a co-creator in a particular way - bringing life into the world with God.

To all mothers, indeed *all* women: know and protect the gift of revelation you truly are.

We thank you, and today above all, we thank God for your vocation, the most beautiful and alluring of them all. The vocation from which all others flow!

First Reading

Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the Sabbath and took their seats. When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them. The next Sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.' It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside. But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Second Reading

Rv 7:9,14-17

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'

Gospel

Jn 10:27-30

Jesus said: 'The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me. I give them eternal life; they will never be lost and no one will ever steal them from me. The Father who gave them to me is greater than anyone, and no one can steal from the Father. The Father and I are one.'
