#### THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN ADVENT

Our lives are filled with journeys. Both literal and figurative. Many of us cannot wait to set out on the journey to see loved ones this Christmas, after a very difficult two years.

Yet it's not just us. The Christmas story too, speaks of a universal journey for the world, and the many other journeys of which it is made. There's the journey of Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem for the census. The journey of the shepherds to see the child. The journey of the wise men, and indeed of the angels to worship and adore. But of course the greatest journey of all, is the baby's own, from the womb into the light... from heaven to earth.

On this fourth Sunday of Advent we hear of another journey, that of Mary to visit her cousin Elisabeth. Imagine the sense of joy, yet confusion too, whirling within this young woman's trusting heart. Mary goes "in haste", to greet her cousin Elisabeth, yet this is no mere catch-up! Rather this meeting of the two expectant mothers has far deeper significance! It is the Old Testament pointing to the New – the Old Covenant, being fulfilled by the New, Eternal Covenant!

The Evangelist Luke is revealing something extraordinary here. Several details, while subtle, are identical to 2 Samuel 6, which narrates the story of King David before the Ark of the Covenant.

In those days Mary arose and set out 'in haste' to the Hill country of Judah, precisely what King David did generations earlier! "And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" Elizabeth exclaims, while David in 2 Samuel 6:9 says, "How can the ark of the Lord come to me?" The ark of the living God now greets Elizabeth, and so too us! Finally, the unborn John we hear "leaps for joy!" King David too "leapt and danced before the Lord".

This encounter tells of the magnificent and final Covenant between Creator and creature; existing now, not in a written commandment alone, but in the living flesh of God! Within the living Ark of Mary now comes the true Covenant, Jesus, law and mercy enfleshed; the living Bread from Heaven.

Many of us will journey this Christmas, yet the Greatest journey will be the one our heart makes to conceive of the fact that God has now come to us in Person! And when Christ comes to us, we cannot be left unchanged!

Pope Francis reminds us of the oldest Advent prayer, which invites God to draw close. "Advent" he says, "is the season for remembering the closeness of God who came down to dwell in our midst." "Let us make the traditional Advent prayer our own: 'Come, Lord Jesus.' ... say it at the beginning of each day and repeat it often, before our meetings, our studies and our work, before making decisions, in every important or difficult moment of our lives: 'Come, Lord Jesus.'"

Advent is both a time of "God's closeness and our watchfulness". "It is important to remain watchful, because one great mistake in life is to get absorbed in a thousand things and not to notice God.

Saint Augustine said: 'Timeo lesum transeuntem' (I fear that Jesus will pass by me unnoticed). Drawn by our own interests ... and distracted by so many vain things, we risk losing sight of what is essential."

"Advent is an incessant call to hope: it reminds us that God is present in history to lead it to its ultimate end, to lead it to its fullness, which is the Lord, the Lord Jesus Christ," Pope Francis says.

"May Mary Most Holy, the woman of the expectation, accompany our steps at the beginning of this new liturgical year, and help us to fulfil the task of Jesus' disciples, indicated by the Apostle Peter. And what is that task? To render an account for the hope that is in us."

Friends, there is no need to book online for **Christmas Masses** this year, but please be aware that we will be limited by number restrictions. While there is no mandate in place, it is recommended that masks be worn in the Cathedral and St Peter Chanel's during these Masses.

Thanks for all you have done these last two, difficult years. Thank you for your patience and support of each other and the office here. Let us hold firm in the hope of our faith, which is beyond human understanding, that the hope of Christmas will strengthen us as we approach 2022, and continue on the journey.

## Readings of the Day - 4th week of Advent - Year C



**Entrance Antiphon:** Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just one; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

**Responsorial Psalm:** Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved. **Gospel Acclamation:** I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia!

**Communion Antiphon:** Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

First Reading Mi 5:1-4

The Lord says this: You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judahout of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

Second Reading Heb 10:5-10

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world: You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me. You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said, just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.' Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading Lk 1:39-45

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
