

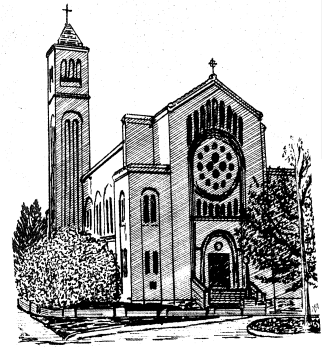

Dear parishioners and visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral parish,

Pope Francis recently proclaimed a *Year of Saint Joseph* through his *Apostolic Letter Patris Corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), to be held through to December 8th 2021. This letter is a significant one, both in its timing and for the fact that marks the 150th anniversary of Pope Pius IX's declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

Pope Francis explains that the aim of this unique year is "to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal." Francis describes St. Joseph as a "beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows."

During the pandemic of the past 12 months, Francis has called on St Joseph for the Church and the world, explaining how he had wanted to share some reflections on the person of Joseph for some time - the pandemic merely increasing this desire and motivation. The crisis our world faces, he writes, highlights the importance of the quiet, humble, and faithful worker; "Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others." All people, the Pope reminds us "can discover in Joseph—the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence—an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble."

Saint Joseph in this way, as he takes up his place quietly, and humbly in the Christmas nativity remains the model of Christian life and love. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation." Indeed, Saint Joseph reminds us all, of our own personal vocation and role in bringing the joy and hope of the Incarnation into our world and the lives of those we know. To protect and love this Truth we have been given.

How significant this masculine, fatherly figure is as we prepare ourselves to welcome the Birth of Christ this week. Joseph had a profound trust in God's providence, and despite the hurdles and confusion at first news of Mary's pregnancy, he honoured and protected her in love. Despite the threats and uncertainty of the flight into Egypt, the slaughter of innocence and no room in the inn, he remained all embracing of God's will, with his own 'fiat' (yes), echoing that of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus himself in the Garden, "regardless of the hardship involved".

But not only did Joseph trust in God—God also trusted him, the Pope notes. "Chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true 'miracle' by which God saves the child and his mother." God acting on his creative courage.

What a year it has been! But friends, let us now draw near to Joseph in imitation of his creative courage - this Christmas in a particular way - who in choosing to face difficult situations with faith and trust, knew his God would give him the grace and strength, at times he may have doubted he had. And so with us.

Parish Collections: Like many in our community our parish has felt the Covid financial pinch. The finance council strongly encourage you to please consider recommencing your weekly financial contributions. While much has been put to a sudden halt, parish cost have continued to rise. Please consider direct debt and electronic forms of contribution to parish planned giving. Thank you for your generosity and support of your parish.

PRESENT PROTOCOLS - Please be familiar with current guidelines

- In accordance with government restrictions, only 260 people are permitted in the Cathedral at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are securely stored and destroyed after 28 days.
- All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- Communion is received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 2sqm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. *NB:* Families can sit together.
- Please use hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided.
- There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates are in use, but money/envelopes can be deposited at collection points.
- Please DO NOT return your bulletin to the basket, but keep or dispose of appropriately. **Please maintain social distancing 1.5m, at all times, including in the single line formed to receive Holy Communion.** Blue squares and yellow markers on the tiles indicate these distances. Thank you for your commitment in keeping everyone safe.

First Reading

2 Sm 7:1-5. 8-12. 14. 16

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent'. Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and you are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever."

Second Reading

Rom 16:25-27

Be Glory to him who is able to give you the strength to live according to the Good News I preach, and in which I proclaim Jesus Christ, the revelation of a mystery kept secret for endless ages, but now so clear that it must be broadcast to pagans everywhere to bring them to the obedience of faith. This is only what scripture has predicted, and it is all part of the way the eternal God wants things to be. He alone is wisdom; give glory therefore to him through Jesus Christ for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Reading

Lk 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.
