

Dear parishioners and visitors,

This week, in the Gospel for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, we hear the people in the synagogue react to Jesus, whose teaching had a 'deep impression' upon them, for he taught with an authority they had not seen before and not as the scribes (Mk 1:22). What was it about this man now in their midst, that caused such a reaction?

Nobody has ever taught like Jesus. Not only did he speak with authority in that he could cast out evil, but he spoke with an authority which was reliant upon no one else; unlike the teachers of his day. When the rabbis taught in the synagogue, they would often quote one expert, opinion and tradition after another. But here, Jesus speaks with the authority of God Himself. Jesus spoke not *of* the Word, but *as* the Word. Indeed, even the unclean spirit itself cries out: "I know who you are: the Holy One of God". Jesus teaches with amazing authority over spirits, over nature, over all things - for He is the Lord of all, the Word of God now in our midst! Let us then, as St Paul exhorts in the second reading, give undivided attention and devotion to the Lord, having the Word of God at the centre of our lives - of all we are, of all we do.

Friends, the Lenten season is fast approaching with Ash Wednesday falling on the 17<sup>th</sup> of February this year, and Easter Sunday on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April. With Lent on the horizon, Archbishop Christopher invites you to join a unique **Archdiocesan Lenten Renewal experience called "Walk in the Spirit."** This retreat experience will be live-streamed for six consecutive Thursdays during Lent from **7.30pm to 9.00 pm, from the 18th of February to 25th March**. Each session will include talks, a moment of sharing and prayer, as well as discussion opportunities. The sessions will be live streamed on the *Catholic Voice YouTube* site, as well as the *Walk in the Spirit website* (<u>https://cgcatholic.org.au/walk-in-the-spirit</u>) and will remain available, to be viewed at your own convenience. Participants will also be provided with a series of formation materials to support them on their Lenten journey.

As a parish we are offering the opportunity to make this journey together, by gathering in small 'hubs'. If you are interested, please contact Leeann Galloway c/- the Parish Office at <u>cathedral@cg.org.au</u>. Let us prepare well for the coming season. Finally, with another year now well upon us, we are looking forward to recommencing our third session of our Young Adults *HOME Group*. This is a fraternal and catechetical group for those aged 18 to 35. These sessions are about hangout out with friends and looking at the deeper questions, as we work through different topics on the Catholic Faith in a relaxed, informal way. *HOME Group* will return on **Wednesday the 17**<sup>th</sup> of February at 6:00pm in the Haydon Hall. We look forward to welcoming back previous participants, but equally too any newcomers! Save the date! Details to follow soon!

#### **PRESENT PROTOCOLS - Please be familiar with current guidelines**

- In accordance with government restrictions, 260 people are permitted in the Cathedral at any one time.
- ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry (including children). Records are destroyed after 28 days.
- Communion is received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 2sgm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. NB: Families can sit together.
- Please use hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided.
- There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates are in use, but money/envelopes can be deposited at collection points.
- Please DO NOT return bulletins, but keep or dispose of appropriately. Please maintain social distancing 1.5m, at all times, including in the single line formed to receive Holy Communion. Blue squares and yellow markers on the tiles indicate these distances. Thank you for your commitment in keeping everyone safe.

# Readings of the Day – 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time — Year B

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Save us, O Lord our God! And gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name, and make it our glory to praise you.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** If today, you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! A people in darkness have seen a great light: a radiant dawn shines on those lost in death. Alleluia!

**COMMUNION ANTIPHON:** Let your face shine on your servant. Save me in your merciful love. O Lord, let me never be put to shame, for I call on you.

#### **First Reading**

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

#### Second Reading

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
