

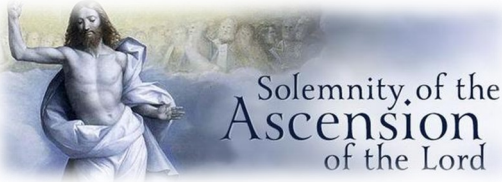
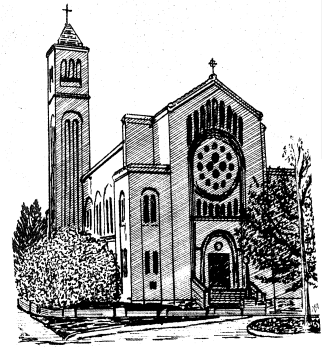

The Ascension of the Lord

As a child, the tabernacle lamp fascinated me I and often found my eyes fixed upon it. It was mesmerising, mysterious and comforting. Of course, as I grew older I began to learn what it spoke of: Jesus' true presence in the tabernacle. Constant and reliable. Day and night. I remember marveling that when the lights were turned off and the doors locked... there was Jesus, still, always remaining.

Some years ago, as I went to lock the church, I found myself reflecting upon all that was occurring in the world, near and far. This week was a similar experience. Before locking the doors, I sat in silence before our Lord, but now, noticing something different. I found myself absorbed not on the light, but 'distracted' by the darkness that surrounded the light. Which is what darkness always seeks to do! Distract! The darkness filled the chapel, almost as if threatening the flame.

I thought to myself – as in years past – what an powerful analogy for the darkness so many are experiencing.

Only this week we heard of yet another horrific murder of the most innocent, this time in Texas. As well as the appalling crimes of war which continue to echo out of Ukraine. But it's not just these. I think too of the insidious darkness and manipulative rhetoric surrounding euthanasia. And all this, in the same democracy which has just emerged from lockdowns designed to *protect* and preserve human life, and its 'worth'. Puzzling... And then of course there is the darkness which clouds our own hearts day to day.

In these times, the world seems more than usual, stooped in darkness. And many do ask: where is God in all of this? Where is He in a world like ours? Many could feel abandoned. Perhaps (one would assume), a feeling the disciples experienced as Jesus ascended to heaven? The Lord, once so close, so real, now vanishing from their sight?

Yet... the Gospel today tells us that the reaction of the disciples could not be more different. Far from feeling abandoned, they are full of joy! It would make more sense to read how shattered and confused they were. But no! Not only are they not upset, they are resolved in their mission, their relationship, and so their identity.

Soon the disciples will preach everywhere where darkness once dwelt, but does no more! Why? Because in this moment they realise the truth of Jesus' promise. A promise which was theirs and so too is ours. This Christ, this God was to be closer to them than ever before. He leaves, in order to come closer.

The truth is, Jesus rose from the dead, but he did not come 'back' from death. Jesus went forward. Transcending and destroying death forever. Forward into Life. This new Life does not reverse the past, but claims it for its own and so transforms it. And it is the Breath, the Holy Spirit that Jesus promises will descend upon his disciples, Who makes this possible. The same breath which raised Him from death, will raise the disciples too from the darkness which threatens them.

The disciples finally understood and relished this truth, and were filled with Joy!

This is especially important for us in these days. Today is a celebration of Jesus' presence with us, not his disappearance. He withdraws from one kind of presence, only to become another kind of presence, through the Divine, life giving Breath which pervades every corner of the human heart; its confusion and suffering.

Jesus has risen to the Father and we now wait in the Upper Room with the disciples, for the Breath of God, the Holy Spirit. God never abandons his own... rather, like that little light surrounded by darkness – the darker the darkness becomes, the brighter the Light and so the Truth of Jesus shines, faithfully journeying with us in this world and never going out.

Entrance Antiphon: Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

Responsorial: God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world.

Communion Antiphon: Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Second Reading

Eph 1:17-23

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel

Lk 24:46-53

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this. 'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.
