FEBRUARY 5th, SOLEMNITY OF THE DEDICATION OF SAINT CHRISTOPHER'S CATHEDRAL



The Parish of Saint Christopher's was born on the 27th of February 1928, with Father Patrick Haydon appointed its first parish priest. It wasn't until 1938 however that the church was built and the following year officially opened.

Canberra, which means 'meeting place' as the young, growing Capital, was so named as it was somewhere that many travellers would come, and so dedicating the Church under the patronage of Saint Christopher – patron saint of travellers – seemed a fitting and appropriate choice.

On the 5th of February 1948 the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn was formally established. The Church was then later extended and on the Silver Jubilee of the Archdiocese, February 5th 1973, Archbishop Thomas Cahill consecrated the extensions and Saint Christopher's became the Cathedral of the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn.

49 years ago, Archbishop Cahill anointed the Cathedral walls in places now marked by marble tiles with gold crosses, and adorned with candles. On the anniversary date each year, these candles burn brightly – reminding all that this sacred building has been set aside as holy, where the living stones who gathering within, come to worship and give glory to God (1 Peter 2:4-6). On Saturday, February 5th, we will celebrate the 49th anniversary of our Cathedral's dedication.

The people of God celebrate the anniversary of the dedication of a church because it is the physical representation of the community of faith which gathers within; it is the place where the Sacred Mysteries of our faith take place. Observing the dedication then, means celebrating the Mystery of the *living* Church, the people of God on pilgrimage to the New Jerusalem.

Saint Christopher's, as the Mother Church of our Archdiocese, is the Eucharistic heart and the sign of unity of our Local Church of Canberra and Goulburn. This significant day therefore is recognised as a solemnity in the Cathedral itself and in all parish churches is celebrated as a feast.

The title "Cathedral", has origins in the Greek "kathedra," meaning "chair." This 'chair' in the sanctuary of each Cathedral is the seat of the bishop, who from this place, as a true shepherd, lovingly guides the life of the Local Church (known as a diocese) entrusted to him by Christ.

We pray for all who have gathered here over 49 years, to worship within the walls of this parish Church and Cathedral. In moments of great sorrow and fear, of immense joy and awe, in moments of national grief and indeed rejoicing, Saint Christopher's stands as a *living* house where God nourishes his people, his living Body. In these sacred walls heaven meets earth.

May every pilgrim who visits this place go forth, having experienced the gentle presence and the merciful Heart of the God who walks among us. And may we continue to invoke the intercession and protection of Saint Christopher as we continue along the pilgrim way.

First Reading

Jer 1:4-5, 17-19

In the days of Josiah, the word of the Lord was addressed to me, saying, 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you came to birth I consecrated you; I have appointed you as prophet to the nations. So now brace yourself for action. Stand up and tell them all I command you. Do not be dismayed at their presence, or in their presence I will make you dismayed. I, for my part, today will make you into a fortified city, a pillar of iron, and a wall of bronze to confront all this land; the kings of Judah, its princes, its priests and the country people. They will fight against you but shall not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you - it is the Lord who speaks.'

Second Reading

1 Cor 13:4-13 (Longer version: 1 Cor 12:31–13:13)

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes. Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge - for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known. In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

Gospel

Lk 4:21-30 Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips. They said, 'This is Joseph's son, surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside." And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country. 'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to a widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.' When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.
