

#### THE ANTI-BEATITUDES

Sometimes we need to see the opposite of something to get a proper understanding of it. Imagine the horror of the beatitudes if they went like this:

Happy are the rich: because they can have whatever they want.

Happy are the strong: for they have no need others.

Happy are the cheerful: for they are in a good mood.

Happy are the uncaring: for they will not be upset.

Happy are the cruel: for they are not affected by others.

Happy are perverse: for they see pleasure in everything.

Happy the divisive: because they will get their own way.

Happy are those who are assisted in the cause of right: for they have friends here to help them.

Happy are you when nobody bothers you. Rejoice and be glad, because you can do as you please.

Perhaps we do not need to imagine it at all, for many of us this is just the way our world works. It's a system built on selfishness which offers us at best a temporary life of temporary pleasure. It is true that what Jesus' offers us is less comfortable than these antibeatitudes, but his promise is so much greater: We will see God, we will be called his sons, our reward with him will be great, and our sufferings will bring us everlasting joy.

# 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time -Year A - 28/29 January



Entrance Antiphon: Save us, O Lord our God! And gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name, and make it

our glory to praise you.

First Reading Zep 2:3; 3:12-13

Seek the Lord all you, the humble of the earth, who obey his commands. Seek integrity, seek humility: you may perhaps find shelter on the day of the anger of the Lord. In your midst I will leave a humble and lowly people, and those who are left in Israel will seek refuge in the name of the Lord. They will do no wrong, will tell no lies; and the perjured tongue will no longer be found in their mouths. But they will be able to graze and rest with no one to disturb them.

Second Reading 1 Cor 1:26-31

Take yourselves, brothers, at the time when you were called: how many of you were wise in the ordinary sense of the word, how many were influential people, or came from noble families? No, it was to shame the wise that God chose what is foolish by human reckoning, and to shame what is strong that he chose what is weak by human reckoning; those whom the world thinks common and contemptible are the ones that God has chosen – those who are nothing at all to show up those who are everything. The human race has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

Gospel Mt 5:1-12

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them: 'How happy are the poor in spirit: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentile: they shave have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'
