Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish,

Jesus loved the use of metaphors – something which sometimes makes His message a little more difficult to decipher than desirable. On this, the fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time, in addressing his disciples, Jesus once again whispers through the ages: 'You are the salt of the earth, you are the light of the world'.

But why? Why speak in metaphors? Because Jesus desires us to go deeper, beyond the surface level. Jesus uses the metaphor of salt and light (Matt 5:13-14) to describe you and I, to describe the Church – relative to Her mission in the world. But why salt and why light? Consider the characteristics of both; neither, gives anything to itself. In fact, to the contrary, the very purpose of their existence is for something else! One to light, one to flavour and preserve. Salt does not exist for itself, nor does light illuminate itself. Rather, they benefit those who come into contact with them.

Even more striking however is what Jesus says next. "If salt loses it's 'taste' (its saltiness) what use is it?" Science has shown that salt can't lose its taste! Its 'saltiness'. Sodium chloride... salt, is a chemical compound. Not a complex composition like wine, which can become bitter, nor an organic compound like meat or cheese or bread, which can spoil or rot. Salt is salt, pure and sim-

So did Jesus just get it wrong? Did He mistakenly use the wrong metaphor? What does He really mean when He says, "but if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot..."? It almost sounds like a warn-

Jesus is referring to the salt losing its usefulness or purpose – and how does it lose its usefulness, its purpose? - when it remains unused! When it remains in the salt shaker!

We fail to live as the salt of the earth when we prefer to stay in the safety of the salt shaker – rather than claiming our faith in the world. Christ always challenges us, in order to change us. Some of what are often referred to as the 'harder sayings' of Jesus are exactly that, and sometimes we try our best to avoid or even water them down...

We are to be 'seasoning' for the world, and at the same time to serve as a preservative of all we have received (1 Cor 15:3), like salt to keep the world from 'going bad'... to preserve what is right and good and true. But when salt is kept to itself it becomes, ineffective and useless! We lose our "saltiness", our distinctive witness as Sons and Daughters of God, when we simply blend in with the world... when we look and sound and act as everybody else... "oh well, that's what everybody does these days!" If this is the attitude of the Christian –What good are we then?

"You are the light of the world." Light too is not threatened by darkness. There is no measure of darkness that can swallow up light. Darkness cannot quench light. In fact, the greater the darkness, the greater the power of a single source of light to show the way. "You are the light of the world," Jesus said. So do not fear the darkness. But rather - 'as ones sent out from Me, Christ -Go conquer it by the active witness of your love, a love that abides in and finds its source in Me.'

Jesus doesn't simply suggest: "You know what, you're like salt of the earth..." Rather He says, "you are the salt of the earth", referring to our identity. We already have what we need to make a difference in the world... by virtue of our baptism into the Body of Christ. Our very being is sacramental, a sign and instrument of God's love, grace and mercy as the Body of Christ. So let us allow Christ's light to shine, and to give hope, joy and brave witness to all whom we encounter in this coming week, and always.

Always know of your priests' prayers for you.

First Reading Is 58:7-10

Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.' If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

Second Reading 1 Cor 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

Gospel Reading Mt 5:13-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'
