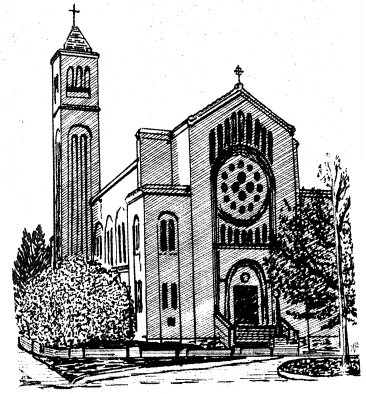

Dear Parishioners of St Christopher's Cathedral Parish

"The loveliest masterpiece of the heart of God is the heart of a mother." – St. Therese of Lisieux

Happy Mother's Day! We pray for our mothers this day, those with us, those who have died, and of course mothers to be; but equally we think of the great gift of Motherhood given by God. What an admirable, enthralling and divine gift. It is the greatest of vocations, despite the misguided reflections often eddying around a secular world. Thank God for the gift of motherhood, which is truly a witness and participation in God's creative, nurturing love.

May is traditionally dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, where we observe a particular devotion and veneration of Mary, the Mother of God and our own spiritual mother. We recall the great mystery of the God Who chose to place Himself, tiny and helplessly dependent, into the protective womb, loving arms and gentle hands of a human mother. From Mary, God took human flesh, all because of her faith-filled yes. Mary was chosen by God above all women, her faith and obedience to God's free invitation and grace, granted the way to the Incarnation and our salvation. Her example then teaches us faith, obedience, humility and most of all, how to *truly respond* to love by responding to the call of Love Himself.

It's fitting then that we begin May with the celebration of *Mother's Day*. Motherhood is a vocation beyond compare; for a mother is a co-creator in a particular way, bringing life into the world with God. And yet such a call requires a *yes*, a *fiat*. The twentieth century theologian Hans von Balthasar evokes this image when he speaks of the Church as Marian. The Church is only Herself he says, in so far as She echoes the *yes* of Mary. Mary is the model of discipleship. What is said of Her is said of the Church. Jesus' ministry began and ended close to His Mother. At every step Mary gave her profound and abiding *Yes, Let it be done according to your word* (Lk 1:38). This is the Church. May we too as the Church be courageous enough in these days to echo this *yes*. Which leads us to contemplate today's Gospel.

People often say 'I'd love to be a fly on the wall', well today we seem to do exactly that with Jesus and his disciples. And yet Jesus knows we're listening (or at least hopes we are); for his words in the Gospel are words spoken to us. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me." (Jn 14:1ff.)

Many years ago I visited a beautiful Benedictine abbey founded in 1230 by King Alexander of Scotland. The abbey flourished for centuries, only to fall into ruins and abandonment as a result of the Protestant Reformation. After passing through private hands over centuries, in the summer of 1948 the abbey was reopened and the monks returned to its walls, filling the house of God again with the joyous chants that were rightly at home in God's Temple. *Had God ever really left?*

God is always the same, and so too is what he does; He never changes. This is the call we've all received, the call He began to chant in our hearts all those years ago... He is still singing, whether we see it, feel it, believe it or not! Things might and do change for us personally, but *never* for God. His song never changes. When we answer and resign ourselves to this fact, this calling is able to grant us the greatest peace and joy. And yet it doesn't shelter us from experiencing and feeling the deepest pain... no! It doesn't prevent suffering from entering our hearts, our lives and even our church. In fact perhaps it makes us more acutely aware of it. But what it does do... is accompany us through it all. Christ accompanies us through it all.

As the days of that summer of 1948 approached, the Abbey awaited its reopening. There was a young man who, a nephew of one of the 're-founding monks', had promised to visit his uncle that inaugural day. Late, the evening before, he pulled up to the quiet, almost eerie abbey, and as he closed the door of his car, he paused... because slowly wafting from deep within the newly restored chapel could be heard the angelic chants of the monks – life had returned to the abbey! He stood for a moment, it seemed the monks were praying *Compline* ('night prayer') and fearing he would disturb the 'great silence' to follow, he decided to return the next morning. Humbled, with a tear running down his cheek, he drove down the foggy driveway.

The next day, mid-morning, he pulled into the pebbled driveway only to find his uncle (in his habit) awaiting his arrival. "I am so sorry! I arrived last night" he said, "but standing outside the chapel I heard you all praying... I didn't want to disturb you." Surprised and somewhat confused, his uncle replied: "We only arrived this morning!"

Just as that ancient abbey over centuries refused to be silenced, refused to forget and refused to cease calling those faithful monks who united themselves to God's so devoutly in its walls for centuries, so too God never ceases calling and *singing* in every human heart! *And Why?! Because it is... you are, God's dwelling place.* And God continues to call, to yearn, to have returned to Him what is His! Our God refuses to stop calling *us* to Himself.

No matter where we've been, or what we've done, He is a God who rejoices at the one who is found. The *Father* of the prodigal son, the *Woman* who finds the lost coin, the *Shepherd* who goes out for the lost sheep. God is revealing to us Who He is. He will never tire... he waits for each of us to return and answer the call placed within our hearts.

I tell this story because often, and I always preach to myself, though we may feel that He is absent from our lives, that the building which once so easily housed Him, is now not fit, or is decaying under our own weakness. Contrary to our thoughts, He never leaves us. He is waiting, singing the song of victory and love within each of our souls, all the time awaiting our return. Sometimes we feel so distanced from God, that our mistakes are too great, but this is a lie. All we need to utter to Him is a *yes*.

My joy comes from this, the knowledge that God is working among His people, and that we are continually called to be servants of that mystery. He awaits our Yes. The rest we leave up to Him. God never leaves His dwelling, and though the house may feel for a time empty He will never stop waiting in joyful hope for our (daily) return, to sing His song of Glory in every soul once more; because you are that dwelling. "Do not let your hearts be troubled, nor afraid!"

On a different, final note, at the moment we can not gather physically for the Mass, and we must acknowledge, hard as it is, that this *not* normal. The Mass and us gathering is central and necessary, there is a need for that physical union with Christ's Body, His bodily presence is indispensable. Precautionary measures to minimise the risks of contagion too are important, but let us continue to pray ardently for this time to pass, and "not let our hearts be troubled" in the meantime. With patience and the grace to endure, we have the knowledge and hope that we will gather physically as Christ body, His Church around his table again soon. Until then let us daily make an *Act of Spiritual Communion*, uniting ourselves to the Mass, and immersing ourselves in His Word in the Scriptures. Let us confidently now more than ever, echo our Mother Mary's yes, that God's will may always be done even if we do not understand His ways. A Happy and Blessed Mother's Day to all Mums.

Readings of the Day – 5th Sunday of Easter —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: *O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.*

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *The Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.*

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, alleluia! I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me. Alleluia!*

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: *I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in plenty, alleluia.*

First Reading

Acts 6:1-7

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

Second Reading

1 Pt 2:4-9

The Lord is the living stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him; set yourselves close to him so that you too, the holy priesthood that offers the spiritual sacrifices which Jesus Christ has made acceptable to God, may be living stones making a spiritual house. As scripture says: See how I lay in Zion a precious cornerstone that I have chosen and the man who rests his trust on it will not be disappointed. That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

Gospel Reading

Jn 14:1-12

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am now going to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.' Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me? 'To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work. You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason. 'I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'
