# THE PRIMACY OF PRAYER

There is something which seems very unusual in our first reading. A serious complaint is brought to the apostles, the neglect of widows. This, is a sin, which the Old Testament tells us 'cries out to heaven for justice'. The situation is even direr because the neglect appears to be deliberate and either racially or religiously motivated. These widows aren't being fed because they are foreigners. Who ever is responsible for such a thing is showing a profound ignorance of Christ. These widows have become members of the Church and so are members of the body of Christ. Whoever is responsible for this action doesn't know what it means to be a Christian. This is an issue deeper than a couple of widows going hungry, it shows that there is ignorance and division within the Church.

How does Peter react to such a serious situation? We might expect him to have harsh words with those responsible and to remind the whole community about their new unity in Christ. Instead, St. Peter declares that "It would not be right for us to neglect the Word of God so as to give out food ... " and Peter continues to institute the diaconate.

Is Peter shirking his responsibility? Is he afraid of speaking out? Of course not. Peter has recognised the true cause of the issue - a worldly mind.

The neglect and division occurred because someone was thinking in the way of the world and not in the way of God. Peter must devote himself to prayer so that this doesn't happen to himself and the apostles. Peter cannot overcome the world by immersing himself in it, he

overcomes it by escaping it.

To some this might sound like a cop out, but what if those who shared out the food had prayed? What if those who spread division today, ask God what his will is? What if the thieves and liars and worse of the world, came before God to ask him His thoughts? Prayer must come first in our lives, otherwise selfishness or worldliness will.

# 5th Sunday of Easter—Year A — 6/7 May



Entrance Antiphon: O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia. Responsorial: Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me. Alleluia

Communion Antiphon: I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in plenty, alleluia.

### First Reading

### Acts 6:1-7

1 Pt 2:4-9

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

#### Second Reading

The Lord is the living stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him; set yourselves close to him so that you too, the holy priesthood that offers the spiritual sacrifices which Jesus Christ has made acceptable to God, may be living stones making a spiritual house. As scripture says: See how I lay in Zion a precious cornerstone that I have chosen and the man who rests his trust on it will not be disappointed. That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

#### Gospel

Jn 14:1-12 Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am now going to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.' Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me? 'To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work. You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason. It tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'
