#### THE MERCY AND FEARLESSNESS OF BARNABAS

Our First Reading is quite incredible. Saul has had a miraculous conversion and now, after a few years coming to terms with his new faith, we hear that Saul wants to go and help the apostles. He hasn't just changed his opinion on Christianity, he is determined to become a part of it.

We can easily imagine how the Apostles might be hesitant to accept Saul into their inner circles. Not only was he a public enemy of the faith, but he also encouraged the killing of many of their close friends, men like Stephen, people who they had known and worked with from the beginning of it all. The Apostles were right to fear him. It was sensible for them to doubt the genuineness of his conversion. After all, if he wanted to destroy the faith, why wouldn't Saul go undercover and find out all of their secrets? Trusting this former foe is an extraordinary risk.

What is very meaningful here too is that it's Barnabas who goes and finds Saul and presents him to the others. Barnabas was the replacement for Judas, we could see him as the new guy, we wouldn't judge him if he was to stay quiet and let the others figure things out. But Barnabas shows exemplary courage, he is sent on his own to find out the fate of the Christians who fled Jerusalem. He also after hearing rumours of Saul's conversion, takes the initiative to go and find out for himself.

Barnabas shows great mercy to this man who killed his friends, he takes Saul back to Jerusalem with him. Presumably they would have walked back along the same road where Saul had his encounter with Christ and his conversion.

Arriving in Jerusalem, Barnabas is not afraid to defend Saul. Who, surely, must have been a hated man, a turncoat to the Jews and a killer of Christians. Barnabas takes him by the hand as a brother, and explains all that Saul has done, how he has repented of his crimes, how they were done in ignorance, how Saul preached in the name of Christ, how he was threatened by the Hellenists, and ran to Tarsus for safety.

The Apostles embrace their former persecutor and view him as one of them. We see this beautiful image of Saul preaching Christ with the Apostles in the streets of Jerusalem. The very same places were Saul had persecuted the Church, he now builds it up. In the streets where he committed hatred, he now works mercy.

Brothers and Sisters, let us try to live out the faithfulness and fearlessness of Barnabas, let us pray for our enemies, and work to be reconciled with them, quick to trust God, and to forgive offences against us, let us also pray for the gift of encouragement, that we may speak well of each other, so that the glory of God may be worked through us and our brothers.

## 5th Sunday of Easter—Year B — 27/28 April

#### First Reading

### Acts 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

### Second Reading

1 John 3:18:24 My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything. My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need to be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandment are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to. Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

#### Gospel

John 15:1-8 Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away- he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples."
