

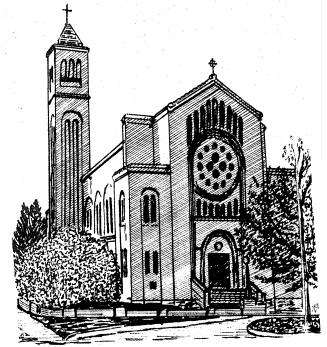

On this 5th Sunday of Lent Jesus proclaims, "unless a grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest." As a child, in kindergarten, we planted sunflower seeds outside the backdoor of the classroom. I remember how fascinated we were, that this small seed would become something so big, a sunflower. We cherished those seeds as they sat on our desks until the day of planting arrived. Yet I recall how horrified we were when Mrs Stone explained how deep we needed to plant them? "That will kill them!" we protested! "No, that will give them *life*!", come the response. What powerful image as we continue our Lenten journey, towards the greatest mystery of all.

The image Jesus uses is twofold. He is of course speaking of his own death – that he must die that we may have life. The seed, however, also says something of us – and our own lives – which bear his image. Jesus qualifies, "Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life." Jesus uses the confronting image of death. Unless a grain of *dies*... It bears nothing.

The question becomes then, how can a grain which is dead produce anything? It cannot! A dead seed is useless. So has Jesus just embarrassed himself?

The death Jesus is speaking of is not simply a physical death, but rather a death far more profound... a death which asks so much more of us, and brings forth only abundant life. You see the seed which falls to the ground never dies.... at least not literally, for if life were no longer in it, it would be useless. Rather it dies to the reality of living and existing only for itself, for its own sake.

Before his passion and death, Jesus teaches us, his children, that so it is with us. A seed not plunged into the rich soil, remains merely a seed, it achieves nothing and remains forever stagnant and eventually sterile. So too with the human life that is not plunged into the rich soil of the mercy, love and life of God. The seed itself does not die, but the truth of the seed existing only for itself, is put to death. And so too must this be for the Christian!

Some of my classmates that day, for fear of losing the seed, placed it only shallowly under the soil's surface, and it bore no fruit. Others left it literally above the soil, and again, no growth, no fruit. But for those who plunged the seed deep within the soil, the results were not only abundant, but alluringly beautiful. Let this be our story too, as we courageously continue on the pilgrim way.

Friends, this weekend will see the return, or rather, the introduction of our new collection bags, to be taken around at the regular time within the Mass. This too is a part proper to the liturgy. In the early years of the Church, the faithful brought bread and wine to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist. These gifts were collected by the deacons during the liturgy. What wasn't used at the Mass was given to the poor and needy. Later, people started bringing other gifts of food or money which were offered for the work and support of the Church. This moment echoes in a practical way the sacrificial action at the heart of worship. I want to thank you all sincerely for your generosity, patience and flexibility during these days and months of change. Since *COVID 19*, understandably, our collections have struggled significantly, however many of you have transitioned to one of the methods of electronic giving, which has been very much welcomed. Thankyou. If you would like to give electronically, please contact the parish office. Any gift in the collection is always very much appreciated and supports your priests and parish. Please give generously. Please know too that an income and expense statement for the calendar year 2020 will be available soon.

First Reading

Jer 31:31-34

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, ‘Learn to know the Lord!’ No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

Second Reading

Heb 5:7-9

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

Gospel Reading

Jn 12:20-33

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, ‘Sir, we should like to see Jesus.’ Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them: ‘Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!’ A voice came from heaven, ‘I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.’ People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, ‘It was an angel speaking to him.’ Jesus answered, ‘It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. ‘Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.’ By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
